## Four fall IM activities come to an exciting close

If anyone walked past the Carmichael fields last Thursday, they no doubt would have stopped to watch the excitement of Almost Anything Goes! In its inaugural year, Almost Anything Goes! was deemed a success by all who participated and especially by the Thundering Hearts—the first IM Anything Goes! champions.

Thirteen teams of three women and three men danced, shuffled together, played piggy-back, downed pizza, and got downright crazy in their efforts to capture the coveted first place plaque.
