Poli sci professor urges attitude change to welfare

Social attitudes must be changed in order to promote the welfare state in America, UNC political science professor Jeffrey Obler told the UNC chapter of the Democratic Socialists of America Tuesday night.

American attempts to develop a welfare state have been set back by President Reagan, Obler said. And the way to improve welfare in America is to change the attitudes of voters, toward expanding the welfare state, he said.

Olber defined the welfare state as an economy in which the tools of production are privately owned and the profits from production are, to a great extent, redistributed to benefit the economically disadvantaged.

Society consists of two groups, Obler said-those who contribute more than they receive from the welfare state (donors), and those who receive more than they pay (recipients). To make public attitudes more favorable to the expansion of the welfare state, the donors must be given a view of the welfare state that they can accept politically.

Today, American liberals are defending the existence and growth of the welfare state by using what he calls the "Moral Duty Model." In this model, the welfare state is justified on the premise that certain economic rights-minimum income standards, basic housing and nutritional needs, and medical care for example—should be guaranteed the same

way that freedom of speech and religion are guaranteed by government.

Obler said liberals could promote the welfare state more successfully by describing it according to what he calls the "State Charity Model." This concept of the welfare state describes government as a huge charity to which every donor must contribute. But is such a model were popularly promoted, Obler said he did not know whether the welfare state would be better off.

Author of 'Lord of the Flies' wins 1983 Nobel Prize

STOCKHOLM, Sweden - William Golding of Britain, author of Lord of the Flies and other novels depicting the savage side of human nature, won the 1983 Nobel Prize in literature Thursday.

The Swedish Nobel Committee cited Golding's novels for their clarity, diversity, and "universality of myth" that "illuminate the human condition in the world today."

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London Times literary editor Philip Howard called Golding one of the three great living British novelists, along with Graham Greene and Anthony Burgess. "He is a very powerful novelist and it's a good award," Howard said. "I don't always feel that about the Nobel Prize, but I do this time."

"I really am delighted," Golding said by telephone from his cottage in Wiltshire,

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Pointing out that it was the first Nobel

literature award to a Briton since Winston Churchill won in 1953, he said, "In a sense one can say I'm in extraordinary company.... I have enough old-fashioned patriotism to be glad not just for myself

but because the prize has been won after

30 years by an Englishman." Golding, 72, wrote stories from the time he was seven, but did not begin his professional writing career until he was 43, with the publication of his best-known novel Lord of the Flies.

The nightmarish story of a group of Fnolish schoolboys stranded on an island

traces their degeneration from innocence to lust and savagery.

It sold millions of copies in Britain and later in the United States, where it became something of a classic among college students in the 1960s - when much of the generation grappled with the agony of the Vietnam War.

In its citation, the Nobel Committee said "Lord of the Flies was a bestseller in a way that is usually granted only to adventure stories, light reading and children's

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

WASHINGTON - The Soviet Union is apparently preparing to deploy to Syria a surface-to-surface missile which would represent a significant new threat to Israel, U.S. intelligence sources said Thursday.

These sources, speaking on condition they not be identified, said there is evidence the Soviets will probably send to Syria the 75-mile range SS-21, which never before has been deployed outside of the Warsaw Pact region in Europe.

Senior defense officials have said the SS-21 is part of a new generation of Soviet surface-to-surface missiles which can carry high explosives or nuclear warheads. If the Soviets were to station SS-21s in southern Syria, such weapons could cover targets in Israel. SS-21s could also pose a threat to Lebanon.

NEW YORK — Cardinal Terence Cooke, the archbishop of New York and chief chaplain for Roman Catholics in the armed forces, died of cancer Thursday after weeks of suffering in which he declared life is "no less beautiful when it is accompanied by ill-

Tributes poured in from the world's top political and religious leaders, ranging from fundamentalist Protestants to liberal Catholic bishops, from President Reagan to Pope John Paul II.

Cooke, 62, died in his home behind St. Patrick's Cathedral at 4:45 a.m. after weeks of pain from "acute leukemia complicating a chronic lymphoma condition," according to the archdiocese.

WASHINGTON - A White House spokesman said Thursday the Senate is "welcome" to vote on whether James Watt should be fired, but President Reagan won't feel bound by it. Another source said the interior secretary will resign, however, rather than be repudiated on Capitol Hill.

This administration official, who spoke on condition that he not be named, said Watt probably will step down in the next two weeks, in light of what looms as a lopsided margin against him in the Republicancontrolled Senate. "Rather than be repudiated in a Senate vote, he will resign," the source said.

RALEIGH - Despite mounting legal challenges to North Carolina's new driving-while-impaired law, state officials are confident the tough antidrunken driving measure will work.

Many of the objections center around a provision allowing a 10-day license revocation for anyone with a blood alcohol level of 0.10 or above. Lawrence Crow of Charlotte is seeking a preliminary injunction to regain his license, saying the law is unconstitutional because the state abused its police powers "by imposing arbitrary and unreasonable means in obtaining its objective."

RALEIGH - Gov. Jim Hunt said Thursday he supported a holiday honoring the late Rev. Martin Luther King but he refused to comment on criticism of the holiday voiced by Sen. Jesse Helms, R-N.C.

"I have nothing to say about that, nothing," Hunt said at his weekly news conference.

Helms, whose re-election bid in 1984 is expected to be challenged by Hunt, agreed Tuesday to end a two-day filibuster and allow an Oct. 18 vote on a bill making King's birthday a national


