

Democrats vow to revive bill tying arms aid to rights

WASHINGTON — President Reagan's veto of a bill to tie continued U.S. military aid for El Salvador to progress on human rights drew sharp criticism Thursday from congressional Democrats who vowed to revive the legislation next year.

House Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill Jr. called the veto a tragic error and said that the human rights measure will be at the top of the House leadership's legislative priorities when Congress reconvenes Jan. 23.

Sen. Christopher Dodd, D-Conn., condemned Reagan's decision as a green light to rightist death squads in El Salvador and vowed to block any additional mili-

tary aid for El Salvador — using a filibuster if needed — until the vetoed bill is law.

"Congress cannot be dealt out of foreign policy decision-making," said Dodd, the author of the original 1981 Salvadoran human rights certification law that expired Sept. 30. The vetoed bill was intended to revive that law.

Among other restrictions, the measure called for withholding at least 30 percent of the \$64 million in military aid slated for El Salvador this year until a verdict is returned in the killings of four American churchwomen three years ago. Five Salvadoran national guardsmen were ordered to stand trial Oct. 28 in the slayings, but an appeal has delayed comple-

tion of the case.

Church groups across the nation organized prayer vigils and other protests on Friday, the third anniversary of the day when the bodies of nuns Ita Ford and Maura Clarke of New York City and Dorothy Kazel and mission worker Jean Donovan, both of Cleveland, were found in a shallow grave near their burned-out van.

While most criticism of Reagan's veto came from Democrats, Sen. Charles Percy, R-Ill., Foreign Relations Committee chairman, said he was disappointed by the president's decision and feared the veto would send a confusing signal to El Salvador at a time of growing right-wing political violence.

Jury convicts former EPA official

WASHINGTON — Rita Lavelle, former head of the government's \$1.6 billion hazardous waste cleanup program, was convicted Thursday on three felony counts of perjury and one count of trying to obstruct a congressional inquiry.

After deliberating for almost seven hours, the jury found Lavelle guilty of lying last February about the date she first learned her former employee, Aero-Jet General Corp., was involved in a California waste dump.

The jury convicted her on two counts of lying before Senate and House committees about this fact and on one count of lying about the date in a sworn statement submitted to Congress.

Lavelle also was convicted of trying to obstruct a congressional inquiry by sending the false statement to Congress.

The only count for which the jury did not return a guilty verdict was a charge that Lavelle lied last February when she denied using her post at the Environmental Protection Agency to help Republican candidates.

On four of the five felony counts brought against Lavelle by a grand jury

last August, however, the 10 women and two men on the jury found her guilty.

The jury returned to the courtroom briefly early in the day after requesting that U.S. District Judge Norma Johnson explain legal points again concerning one of the five counts against Lavelle.

After an eight-day trial, the jury began its deliberations on Wednesday.

Lavelle, 36, faced a total of five felony charges or perjury and obstructing a congressional investigation.

In addition to being briefed on the law, the jury asked to see a key document the government presented in its case against Lavelle.

The document, which formed the basis of two of the charges, was a Dec. 13 letter she wrote explaining when she learned Aero-Jet General Corp. had dumped wastes at the Stringfellow Acid Pits in California.

In the sworn statement and in later testimony before Congress, Ms. Lavelle maintained that she first learned about the corporation's Stringfellow connection on June 17, 1982.

The government contended that Ms. Lavelle was told about Aero-Jet on May 28.
