

Helms announces plans for 1984 election

RALEIGH — Sen. Jesse Helms, R-N.C., said Wednesday he will seek a third term against the expected opposition of Democratic Gov. Jim Hunt in a campaign that attracted national attention long before it became official.

"All I hope is that the people of North Carolina understand the issues and understand where both candidates — or however many candidates there are — where they stand," Helms said after filing papers at the State Board of Elections.

"If my positions on all the issues are understood by the people and they don't want me for the U.S. Senate, that would suit me fine," he said. "I'm not going to sell my soul to get elected."

Hunt has said he will file Feb. 6 after two days of pre-announcement festivities.

Helms, 62, in 1972 became the first Republican senator elected from North Carolina this century. He won the 1978 race with the help of his National Congressional Club — one of the nation's largest political action committees.

The 1984 Senate race in North Carolina is expected to be one of the most expensive in the country, with analysts predicting a total expenditure of \$20 million — \$14 million by Helms alone.

Helms said he had no idea of how much money he would spend in the campaign.

"All I can say is, we'll spend however much we can legitimately raise, and we'll spend it in legitimate ways," he said.

Since his election, Helms has drawn the support of the Moral Majority and the ire of the National Organization for Women, which declared him "public enemy No. 1."

Helms has opposed abortion and busing to achieve desegregation while backing prayer in the schools. He also alienated blacks last session by opposing a national holiday honoring the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.

But Helms' announcement included some conciliatory comments for blacks.

"The leadership of the blacks have written off the black in terms of participating in the two-party system," he said. "Nobody has a greater stake in the survival and prosperity of our free enterprise system than our black citizens. With Democrats in Washington, all they get are handouts."

Helms' political advertisements have criticized Hunt for supporting unions and catering to liberals. During his announcement, he renewed his call for a debate with Hunt, who has offered to discuss the issues only after each man has won his party's primary.

"All I get is remote-control responses from one or more of that battery of press agents he has," Helms said. "I don't know where he (Hunt) stands on anything. I think he stands pretty much where the popular opinion is."

Hunt, a second-term governor, has led a campaign against drunken drivers, continued efforts to attract industry to the state, fought for the Equal Rights Amendment and worked to keep money in the state budget for abortions.

While Helms declined to rank the issues facing the nation, he said improving the economy and restoring foreign policy priorities were important.

State and Nation

BEIRUT, Lebanon — Two men with a silencer-equipped pistol killed the president of the American University of Beirut in the hallway outside his campus office Wednesday.

The coroner said Malcolm Kerr died instantly from a bullet in the head.

An anonymous telephone caller said a pro-Iranian group called Jihad Islami, or Islamic Holy War, was responsible for the slaying. The caller demanded that U.S. and French troops in the multinational force leave Lebanon "or we will shake the earth under their feet."

U.S. special Middle East envoy Donald Rumsfeld arrived from Israel shortly after the killing and met for five hours with President Amin Gemayel. State radio said they discussed ways of easing tensions in Lebanon.

STOCKHOLM, Sweden — Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko delivered a blistering attack on U.S. policies Wednesday, but in a private meeting later he and Secretary of State George P. Shultz appeared to make headway toward better relations.

It was the first high-level contact between the superpowers since U.S.-Soviet arms talks broke off last November. U.S. officials said "the discussion was a good one" and progress was made over a broad range of unspecified issues.

WINSTON-SALEM — The nation's chief justice Wednesday considered a request to end secret jury selection in the Klan-Nazi trial at the Supreme Court ruled in another case that the public has a right to view jury questioning.

Meanwhile, jury selection continued behind closed doors in the trial of nine Ku Klux Klansmen and neo-Nazis accused of violating the civil rights of five Communist Workers Party members shot to death in Greensboro in 1979.

Eight North Carolina newspapers have asked Chief Justice Warren Burger to halt the proceedings. Newspaper attorneys said they expected a ruling soon.

In a California case, the Supreme Court rules unanimously that the constitutional right of reporters and the public to attend criminal trials extends to jury selection.
