

# Sales tax proposed on Girl Scout cookies

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Looking for new sources of income, the Tennessee Revenue Department has asked the state attorney general whether it can tax a great American institution — Girl Scout cookies.

"Tax Girl Scout cookies?" asked Penny Harrington, a lawyer for the Nashville Girl Scout council. "The auditing pro-

blems would be tremendous. It would probably reduce the sales to some degree.

"And can you see those girls keeping up with all those pennies in their grubby little hands?"

Taking no chances on the answer of state Attorney General William Leech, the Girl Scouts have approached state Sen. Doug Henry, who says he will sponsor a bill to exempt the cookies from taxation.

"I think Girl Scout cookies are an institution that's unique," Henry said last week. "I don't think the little girls should have to pay sales tax."

But as far as the Girl Scouts are concerned, that's the way the cookie crumbles, said Hardy Moyers, deputy revenue commissioner for Tennessee.

"There's nothing in the law that says you can sell something and be exempt from the sales tax," he said. "A charitable organization can buy something, like a typewriter, and that's tax-exempt. But if it turned around and sold the typewriter, it would have to be taxed."

**BEIRUT, Lebanon** — Lebanese army troops and Shiite Moslem militiamen fought a one-hour battle in Beirut's southern suburbs Sunday, and initial reports said four people, including one soldier, were wounded.

The fighting was the first major confrontation between the army regulars and Shiite Moslems in the southern suburbs, adjacent to the

U.S. Marine base at Beirut International Airport, in almost a month.

**RALEIGH** — Sen. Jesse Helms, R-N.C., says Gov. Jim Hunt "made a deal" with Virginia Gov. Charles S. Robb on a water pipeline from Lake Gaston to Virginia Beach, but Hunt and Robb aides say there was no such agreement.

The U.S. Army corps of Engineers' division office in Norfolk, Va., approved a permit for the \$176 million pipeline on Jan. 9. The state of North Carolina filed a suit three days later in U.S. District Court challenging the permit's legality.

Helms said Jan. 10 he had "witnesses who will testify under oath" that Joseph W. Grimsley, the

director of Hunt's expected Senate campaign against Helms, was Hunt's representative during the alleged deal.

**RALEIGH** — Republican Bill Cobey of Chapel Hill filed as a candidate Friday for the 4th District Congressional seat now held by Democrat Ike Andrews of Cary.

Cobey's entrance into the 4th District race sets up a possible rematch with Andrews. In 1982, Andrews edged out Cobey after the Republican staged a media blitz and Andrews was arrested for drunken driving. Cobey is a former athletic director at UNC.
