# Atlanta mayor will speak in Memorial Hall

In 1972, Young was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives from Georgia's 5th Congressional District, the state's first black congressman in 101 years. He was re-elected in 1974 and 1976, and served as UN ambassador in the Carter admininstration from January 1977 to September 1979.

In October 1981, Young was elected mayor of Atlanta. He is a graduate of Howard University and the Hartford Theological Seminary. He also is a recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor.

### Boy George albums banned

PROVO, Utah - Boy George is a hit on the pop charts, but not in the bookstore at Brigham Young University, where albums of his group Culture Club have been pulled from shelves pending a

review. "It is more an evaluation of the artist than of his music," said bookstore director Roger Utley, adding that the records would be reviewed for their suitability for students.

"We're just not sure what is appropriate to sell on campus," he said. Paul Richards, a spokesman for the Mormon-owned school, said: "The administration has no standard policy on Boy George. It's a bookstore matter."

Utley said he decided to remove the albums because of recent action taken by student program officials.

Culture Club was to be used as a theme for the campaign of a student Culture Office candidate, Ruth Terri, who planned to use posters featuring herself posed with several people dressed as Culture Club

She said she was not to use the photo because Ryan Thomas, director of student programs, felt Culture Club promotes homosexuality and transvestism.

## Gunmen fire in Jerusalem

JERUSALEM — An attack by three Arab gunmen in the commercial center of west Jerusalem left 48 people wounded, one of them critically.

The trio threw hand grenades and fired automatic weapons in the 10-minute spree before one was shot and killed by bystanders and the other two were captured by police.

Responsibility for the attack was claimed by the Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine, a hardline faction of the Palestine Liberation Organization, in a communique issued in Damascus, Syria.

#### Pre-primary debate OK'ed

WASHINGTON - The Federal Communications Commission ruled Monday that broadcasters can sponsor debates between candidates before primary elections without fear of having to give candidates not in the debate equal time under the fairness doctrine.

The ruling could clear the way for senatorial candidates Jim Hunt and Jesse Helms to debate before the May primary election. Hunt has refused to debate Helms before the primary, News In Brief

despite repeated calls from Helms for a statewide televised debate. The issue was raised by the N.C. Association of Broadcasters and a New Bern television station that wanted to produce a Helms-Hunt debate before the primary.

#### Gaye death unresolved

LOS ANGELES — A Los Angeles police detective said that "we may never know" the reason for the murder of singer Marvin Gaye Sunday afternoon, after an argument that began Saturday.

"The mother said that it was over insurance," Detective Lt. Robert Martin said. "What exactly about insurance, we don't know."

Gaye's father, age 69, was later booked for investigation of his son's murder and is being held without bail. A police spokesman said they expected the elder Gaye to be arraigned Wednesday.






