RALEIGH - Lt. Gov. Jimmy Green, speaking before about 1,500 supporters at a packed Raleigh Civic Center, said Friday night he can win the May 8 gubernatorial primary and denounced North Carolina newspaper polls that have shown Green trailing his other five Democratic opponents.

"How many of you in here have been polled?" Green asked, looking out at the audience and counting "one two .. six. Six of you have been polled! I'm amazed some candidate can pay a pollster \$25,000 to poll and say we have four, eight, or nine percent. There will be a surprise in May.

"You and others across the state will nominate a Democrat, and you'd better nominate a man who can win in November," Green said. "And you're looking at him!"

Among those attending the third annual Jimmy Green Springfest were state Sen. Wanda Hunt, D-Moore; House Speaker Liston Ramsey, D-Madison, and Sen. Kenneth Royall, D-Durham.

Green, 63, is the oldest candidate in the race, but he challenged the crowd to decide if his age was an issue. "Do you think I look old?" Green asked the crowd.

Following a resounding "no," Green said, "I'm just a "oung fella. I'm just beginning to fight, and don't forget

for a moment that I am full of fight."

Green brought his family on stage and asked how state prosecutors could put his family through the ordeal of a bribery trial in which he was found innocent last October.

"It is a shameful, shameful way to be treated," he said. "I guess Jimmy Green was in somebody's way and they wanted to move him. But I never lost my faith or my dignity, and I pray every day that this will never happen to any of you or any other North Carolinians."

Green called getting job and tax credits along with industrial recruitment to those parts of North Carolina needing them a key issue in his campaign.

U.S. rejects Nicaraguan forum


WASHINGTON - Expressing. fears that Nicaragua might use the World Court as a propaganda platform, the United States announced Sunday it would not accept the forum's jurisdiction in Central America disputes for two years.

"We believe that, as evidenced by their appeal to the United Nations Security Council, recent Nicaraguan behavior has shown a lack of serious interest in addressing regional issues," the State Department said in a statement. "We do not wish to see the court abused as a forum for furthering a propaganda campaign."

Chernenko issues arms statement

MOSCOW - Soviet leader Konstantin Chernenko said in an interview published Sunday that, despite "contacts with the American side," the superpowers remain deadlocked on arms control with no sign of a breakthrough.

Chernenko painted a bleak picture




of Soviet-American relations and the threat posed by recent escalations in nuclear arms. "The situation in the world is not improving. It remains very dangerous." His statements were carried by the official Soviet news agency Tass and read over Soviet television.

Representative says continued aid depends on El Salvador election

The upcoming election in El Salvador between right-wing leader Roberto D'Aubuisson and moderate candidate Jose Napoleon Duarte is of great significance to the United States, a con-

gressional expert on Latin America said here Friday. Rep. Michael D. Barnes, D-Md., said

in a panel discussion that American aid to El Salvador hinged on the outcome of the runoff election scheduled for early May. Barnes, a 1965 graduate of UNC, is chairman of the Høuse Western Hemisphere Affairs Subcommittee.

"I would argue that the elections are extremely important," Barnes said. "If D'Aubuisson is elected, the Reagan administration would not be able to request military aid (from Congress). It would be

the equivalent of the president asking for aid to support the regime of Adolf Hitler."

But if Duarte wins and then asks the United States for more aid, he will have little trouble. Barnes said.

Also appearing at the discussion were Alberto Arene, a Washington representative for the two main left-wing forces in El Salvador, and Jaime Suchlicki, head of the Center for Inter-American Studies at the University of Miami.


