

# Students for Edmisten plan election strategy

With the November elections nearing, gubernatorial candidate Rufus Edmisten's UNC campus campaign plans voter registration drives, volunteer work at Orange County Democratic headquarters and a possible campus visit by Edmisten.

Duray Taylor, a third-year law student from Marshall, said Monday that Edmisten campus workers will meet every other week until the Nov. 6 election and will assist in the Democratic unity campaign.

"I'd like to encourage all our workers to remember not only to work for Rufus, but to work for the benefit of Democratic Party victories overall," Taylor said.

"We will coordinate our meetings around those with other candidates and the young Democrats so we can support each other."

Edmisten, currently attorney general, faces Republican Jim Martin in the governor's race.

Kelly Keller, a junior from Sanford who acted as UNC coordinator for Edmisten's campaign during the primary season in the spring, is heading the statewide college campus effort and hopes to get candidate receptions at the different campuses before the election.

"Rufus wants to get back to UNC before the election. He went to school here and has an attachment to the community," Keller said.

Edmisten is planning a luncheon appearance at the

Holiday Inn in Chapel Hill Friday but will not be on campus. The campus coordinators are in charge of ticket sales, which will cover the cost of the meal.

Keller, who oversees three regional campus coordinators, reiterated support for Edmisten campus groups working with local Democratic organizations.

"We are trying to tie the colleges to the counties so they can work with the county organizations such as the county Democratic Party headquarters," Keller said Monday. "That is where they are needed most."

Students would work phone banks, mailouts and basic grassroots campaign work.

Edmisten finished first in a field of 10 candidates in the Democratic gubernatorial primary in May, then defeated Eddie Knox in the runoff in June.

# Tanker attacked in Gulf

**NANAMA, Bahrain** A rocket hit a Panamanian tanker Monday and the captain radioed he was heading to Dubai in the United Arab Emirates for repairs, Persian Gulf shipping sources said.

The sources said an Iranian warplane almost certainly carried out the attack.

They said the U.S. Navy warship King, a guided missile destroyer, was about 50 miles from the Cleo 1 at the time of the attack and offered help, but that the tanker reportedly replied it needed none.

The King is part of an 11-ship U.S. force in the Middle East that patrols gulf waters and the Indian Ocean.

The 20,880-ton Cleo 1, bound from Colombo, Sri Lanka, to pick up crude at Saudi Arabia's oil terminal of Ras Tanura, was the latest victim in the "tanker war" involving Iraq and Iran, according to the sources, who spoke on condition they not be identified. At least 40 have been hit since February.

The Cleo 1's captain radioed no distress signals, but reported his vessel was struck by a single rocket. He said he was forced to change course and use emergency steering to proceed to Dubai.

The Cleo 1 was attacked about 10 a.m., eight hours before it was due to dock at Ras Tanura, pick up crude and then sail back to Sri Lanka, said the ship's agent in Ras Tanura. It was about 60 miles northeast of the northern tip of Qatar at the time, shipping sources said.

### Teacher pegged for space

**WASHINGTON** — President Reagan announced Monday he has ordered a nationwide search for a school teacher to be the first citizen passenger to journey into space on the space shuttle.

Speaking to teachers and administrators from some of the nation's outstanding public secondary schools, Reagan began the process of elimination that will settle a question that has long fascinated space buffs and dreamers: Who will be the first member of the public in space?

Shuttle flights currently are restricted to astronauts, mission specialists and payload specialists, all with specific tasks to perform on board the spacecraft.

The teacher, to be selected from one of the nation's elementary or secondary schools, would be the first observer to fly a mission.

### Women's issues debated

Sen. Jesse Helms' re-election campaign spokesman Monday accused Democratic challenger Gov. Jim Hunt of practicing "the politics of division" after female Hunt supporters criticized Helms as weak on women's issues.

Spokesman Claude Allen said Helms favored equality for women, but that the Equal Rights Amendment and other programs backed by Hunt and his supporters were "radical feminist."

Seven women, led by executive director Susan Law of the Northwest Child Development Council, said in a news conference that Hunt "has a clear understanding" of their feelings on such topics as pay equity, Social Security, the environment and the arms race.

"We believe that Senator Helms devotes too much of his time pushing his own special causes and too little time representing the hopes and aspirations of North Carolina's women," said Law.

### Rate hike condemned

**RALEIGH** — An expert in utility regulation has told the N.C. Utilities Commission that 90 percent of a Southern Bell request for a 27.4 percent rate increase should be denied.

In testimony filed with the commission Monday afternoon, Dr. John W. Wilson of the Washington-based J.W. Wilson and Associates based his conclusion on 86 pages of research, according to the N.C. attorney general's office.

A spokesman for Southern Bell declined comment on the testimony.

"Dr. Wilson is one of the foremost independent utility experts in the United States," Attorney General Rufus Edmisten said Monday in releasing Wilson's testimony. "He found that at least 90 percent of Southern Bell's rate increase request should be denied. That means Bell is entitled to no more than a 2.5 percent rate increase."
