and to Davis Library would be discussed at the UNC Board of Governor's meeting in October.

The University's cable system "has the potential to do a lot, and it depends on how priorities are set, and how things are funded," Harward said.

Mark Stafford, president of the Residence Hall Association, said students wanted cable television in their dorms.

"I think students would pay \$10 per semester in rent increase for it," he said. "The problem is just doing it the most efficient way, whether to string a cable or do a (satellite) dish."


