

# Candidate Ferraro will campaign in N.C.

Democratic vice presidential candidate Geraldine Ferraro will visit North Carolina Oct. 1, said Ed Turlington, political director for the state's Mondale-Ferraro campaign branch. Ferraro is scheduled to speak at rallies in Greensboro and Raleigh, followed by a \$500 per couple private reception at the home of Jeanette Carl, state Department of Transportation board member, and a \$100 per ticket N.C. Democratic fund-raiser at

Raleigh's Mission Valley Inn. Although it is unlikely she will visit UNC before the election, her son, John Zaccaro Jr., campaigned on behalf of the ticket in Chapel Hill last weekend. "We're always hopeful she'll come back — we're fortunate to have her come to North Carolina," Turlington said. "She is only visiting selected states and has a busy campaign schedule ahead of her." Turlington said he hopes Mondale will be able to appear in North Carolina before the campaign. The N.C.

Mondale-Ferraro campaign will do all they can to ensure both candidates return to North Carolina, including the University, he said. Mark Gustafson, president of the UNC Young Democrats, said the Young Democrats will be working to bring state and national Democratic candidates to campus. Former Democratic presidential candidate Jesse Jackson spoke to University students

in Memorial Hall Wednesday morning. "On campus we will also be working with all Democratic candidates at all levels to have as much of a unified campaign," Gustafson said. "Our unity campaign will include voter registration drives, volunteer work at the Orange County Democratic Headquarters and canvassing. The unified campaign is the key to getting our candidates elected," he said.

# Embassy blast kills 2

WASHINGTON — Two Americans and at least four or five Lebanese employees were among those killed in yesterday's terrorist blast outside the U.S. Embassy annex in a Beirut suburb, Richard Murphy, assistant secretary of state for Mideast affairs, said today.

He said the death toll was not final. Another official said four or five Americans were seriously wounded, and John Hughes, the State Department spokesman, said there were 20 Americans injured. He indicated as many as 16 of those were hospitalized.

Hughes said the dead apparently were military personnel. Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger said the dead were assigned to the defense attaché's office.

Hughes told reporters that two terrorists in an explosive-packed van shot their way through one checkpoint about a block from the embassy entrance and drove 500 feet under fire from Lebanese guards until they finally stopped at another checkpoint at a wall just 20 feet from the northern entrance into the embassy, but still on the street. He said the van then exploded, severely damaging the embassy building.

### Meese cleared by prosecutor

WASHINGTON — A special prosecutor reported today he found no basis "for the bringing of a prosecution" against presidential counselor Edwin Meese III, whose nomination by President Reagan was to attorney general bogged down in

charges of ethical misconduct. Special prosecutor Jacob A. Stein, reporting to a special court which appointed him to investigate allegations concerning Meese, said he looked only for violations of the law and would "submit no comments on Mr. Meese's ethics and the propriety of his conduct or an evaluation of Mr. Meese's fitness for office."

The three-judge panel accepted Stein's report and made it public.

Meese said the special prosecutor's report had "cleared the air" and that he hoped it would open the way for his confirmation by the Senate as attorney general.

### GM, union resume talks

DETROIT — General Motors Corp. and the striking United Auto Workers union have moved closer to agreement on the crucial issue of job security, a UAW local president said as contract talks resumed Thursday.

About 108,000 GM employees were either on strike or laid off as the effects of walkouts by UAW locals in 10 states rippled through the No. 1 automaker and related companies.

UAW President Owen Bieber offered no comment Thursday morning as he entered the negotiating session on the fifth floor of GM headquarters in Detroit.

But union officials have kept local union officials generally informed on the talks, although even the local members know few details.
