

Watch out for those Mangum ghosts!

Lovers of the gruesome and ghastly, and people with a strong desire to scream in fright will want to visit Mangum residence hall's annual Haunted House next Tuesday and Wednesday.

Mangum residents will be scaring people with chainsaws and strobe lights from 9 p.m. to midnight each night, said organizer Davis Bradshaw, a sophomore from Raleigh.

Profits from admission will go to the N.C. Burn Center. Mangum raised about \$1,300 for the organization last year, Bradshaw said.

The scenario includes a creature that will walk the stairways carrying an operating chainsaw. "We take the chain off," he said. "People think it is real." The blinking lights from the strobe bulbs in the stairway create a frightening

effect, he promised.

Organizer Narinder Dahya, a sophomore from Raleigh, said visitors would crawl through a dark tunnel on the third floor listening to "spooky sounds." "We will be using music from the movie *Halloween* and Disney sound effects," he said. Dahya said the students would end in the bathroom seeing a mad scientist cut off someone's leg.

"My leg got cut off last year," Bradshaw said. "We made a fake leg out of ground beef, and I stuck my real leg in a hole." He said the chopping of a dull machete on his fake leg caused many screams from the visitors.

Strange hands will reach for visitors in dark halls covered with black spray-painted newspapers. "Sometimes the visitors get too scared and start grabbing back," he said. And then...

Tickets are \$1 on sale this week. Dahya said he hoped students would

buy tickets in advance. "Last year we had a line stretched around the dorm," he said. "Some people did not get in."

Monroe County Prosecutor Ronald Waicukauski gave this account of events based on investigators' reports:

Zook attended a party at the fraternity at about 2 a.m. Sunday.

Outside the house, a pickup truck pulled up and almost struck Zook. Zook and some fraternity members got into a fight.

Some friends eventually got Zook to leave and took him back to the apartment complex where he was staying.

Zook entered the fraternity house through a side door at about 4 a.m., got two cans of turpentine from the basement, splashed it throughout the living room and set it afire. He then returned to the nearby apartment.
