rare as a winning check from Publisher's Clearing-house. Recently, in a blatant move justly criticized by Cobey, Andrews finished up his legislative session with a round of letters to the folks back home. Also,



families with a kindergarten-like center and a bill attached to the Older Americans Act which is designed to improve the ability of older Americans to maintain their own health better in coordination with students from schools of public health.

"My opponent has done some sick, sloganized politicking and I don't think you can campaign intelligently that way," he added. "You can't have any conception of Ike Andrews' 22 years of service to the people that way."

With Congress finally out of session, Andrews has conducted a whirlwind tour of the district to stave off Cobey's active 1984 grass-roots oriented campaign. He's used two themes: the pragmatic, experienced Andrews and the Reagan-Helms clone Cobey — unaware of the deficits and caught up in the social issues of the New Right, mixed in with jobs at Cobey's two-campaign losing streak. "Does Bill Cobey have a job? He's a fine gentleman and all but he's been campaigning for four years."

Both Andrews and Cobey say 1984 is a different year. While the organization of Gov. Jim Hunt pulled out the stops for Andrews in 1982, this time he said his campaign had "more support than I have ever had in my life." The contributions are flowing in and he adds

that the 1982 total of \$205,982 will be easily surpassed. "That's more money than I've ever had."

Of course, for Cobey, 1984 is different because Reaganomics appears to be working. As Vice President George Bush is wont to say, "Unemployment is down, inflation is down, more Americans are working now than at any other time in this nation's history and Walter Mondale can't stand it."

How long Reagan's coattails will be in a district where the Democrats hold a 3 to 1 registration edge is uncertain but Cobey says on Main Street 4th District the Mondale tax increase plan isn't playing well. "If Reagan came this time, it would be tremendous," Cobey said. Since the interview, Vice President George Bush has appeared with Cobey in Raleigh.

But the 4th District race could hinge on two perceptions. Will voters take Cobey's independence from the Congressional Club as genuine? Will they see Andrews as an on-the-job congressman or not on the job, but better than Cobey?

as an old-line rural Democrat not highly enamored of labor unions, Andrews seemed out of touch with a district coming more and more under the influence of the futuristic spires of the Burroughs Wellcome building and the high-tech growth the Research Triangle represents.

So how can Andrews continue to win the hearts of the voters in Randolph, Chatham, Orange, Wake and Franklin with a 68 percent attendance record on roll-call votes, a 30 percent attendance rate on his most important committee, the House Education and Labor committee and no highly visible legislative accomplishments?

"I have some strong ambitions and I believe in what I'm doing," Andrews said in a telephone interview from Washington before the session ended. "I love all my programs." Those include the Head Start program, which provides the children of low-income

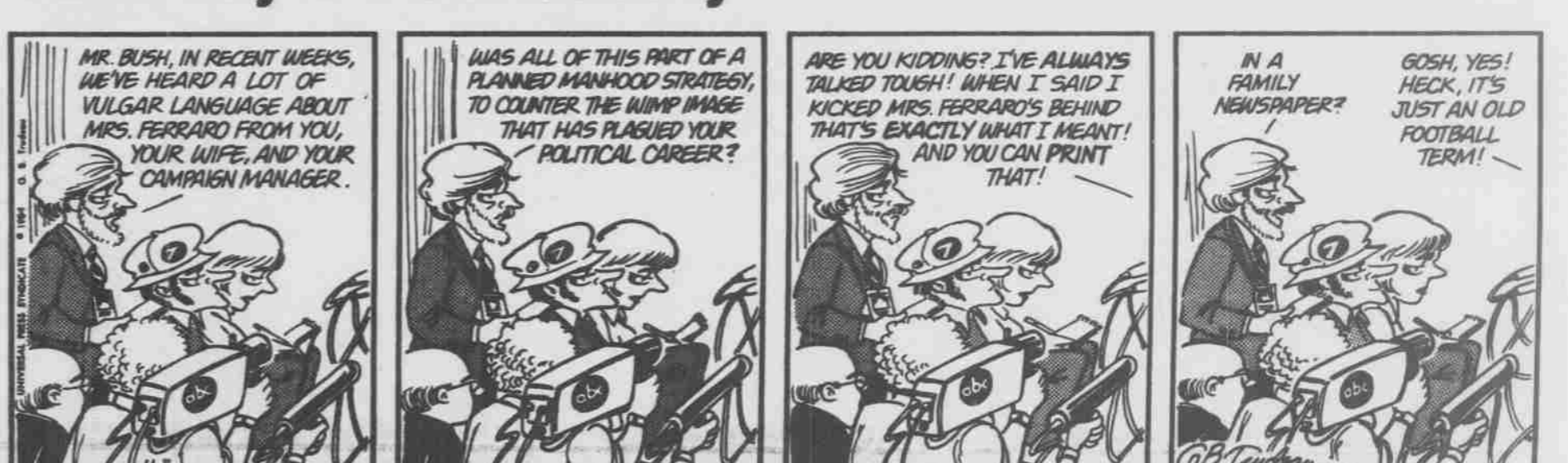
