

Fencing may appear violent, but it produces few serious injuries. It is similar to boxing in that it is a head-to-head battle requiring total concentration; but while a boxer relies on power and brawn, the fencer must develop agility and split-second hand-eye coordination to complement a mental toughness. The ability to manipulate an opponent psychologically often can make up for inferior physical talent.

Back in the basement of Fetzer Gym, the UNC-State fencing match ended at 9 p.m., more than four hours after it began. UNC beat State decisively in both the men's and women's divisions. But there was no dancing on Franklin Street; instead, the teammates chatted, congratulated each other and turned off the lights on their way out.
