

"Our committee opposes the index because it takes the teeth out of Proposition 48," said Samuel H. Poole, chairman of the BOG's Committe on Intercollegiate Athletics. "If you follow the index through, the real result is no minimum SAT or GPA."

The index would require that an athlete have a minimumm 1,500-point requirement to participate in a varsity sport as a freshman.

In determining the index, the athlete's GPA multiplied by 400 would be added to the athlete's SAT score.

The BOG committee's report asks the chancellors, faculty representatives and athletic directors of the UNC-system schools to work with President William Friday in opposing the eligilibility index.

Under the index's formula, Poole said, an athlete could have an SAT score of 400 — the lowest score possible — a 2.75 GPA (C-plus average) and still be eligible to play a varsity sport. "We believe it is important that the

BOG act promptly to give clear guidance to our chancellors and a clear signal to all parties of our position," Poole said at the Friday meeting.

The committee will submit its full report to the BOG next month, but the BOG approved the interim report opposing the eligibility index because committee members wanted to state the BOG's position before the NCAA meets in early October.

UNC-system President William C. Friday said: "We understand that the committee's report is an instruction. I hope it will be a signal to other boards around the country that they take similar action."

Members of the NCAA will meet to discuss the issue with the NCAA's President's Commission on Oct.1 and 2 and with the NCAA Council on Oct. 14 through 16. UNC has representatives on both groups.


