Meanwhile the North Carolina offense was going three plays and then punting, or turning the ball over. The Georgia Tech "Black Watch" defense was all it was cracked up to be as UNC's longest drive of the half was six plays.

The only thing that could be considered a bright spot was freshman tailback Brad Sullivan's 62 yards rushing in replacement of the injured William Humes.

The closest the Tar Heels came to scoring was on a bomb to Eric Streater in the second quarter. Streater was open and Anthony let one loose, but it went into the teeth of a brisk wind and ended up in the hands of Tech's Sammy Lilly.

As the game wore on, the cheers grew louder for every drive the Watch stopped.

"We just came up empty time after time," Anthony said. "We couldn't seem to get much of anything going."

Any thoughts of a North Carolina comeback were obliterated as Tech took the second-half kickoff and steamrolled 80 yards in 14 plays. Typical of the day, Dewberry fumbled on a key third-and-six, recovered, escaped from the pocket and gained seven yards for a first down. Six plays later he found Tim Mannion across the middle for 13 yards and a 24-0 lead.

On its next drive, UNC faced a fourth down and two on the Tech 46, but Crum opted to punt. "Yeah, I wanted to go (for the first down)," Anthony said. "But that's coach Crum's decision and that's fine. We do what coach Crum calls."

Crum did go for a first down on UNC's next drive. On a fourth-and-eight from the Tech 36, UNC faked a punt, but Kenny Miller fumbled after gaining two yards. Cory Collier recovered for the Yellow Jackets and North Carolina frustrations resulted in their second on-the-field fumble in two weeks. A couple of Georgia State Troopers came on field to break it up.

In the fourth quarter, Mays (who finished with 123 yards rushing) took a pitch from Dewberry and passed 26 yards downfield to Lee for the latter's second catch — and second touchdown — of this 31-0 game.

In light of its previous week's 14-3 win at Clemson, Georgia Tech appears

to have an inside track at its first ACC football title. The Rambling Wreck is 3-1 in the conference with only Duke and Wake Forest remaining on its ACC schedule.
