V-ball upsets Duke in thriller

A little early-season history was made Tuesday night when North Carolina's unranked volleyball team upset Duke in the conference opener before a vociferous crowd of 308 in Carmichael Auditorium.

Employing the relentless spiking techniques of Jill Berkebile, Andrea Wells and Sharon German, UNC posted a 15-6, 8-15, 15-10, 15-10 win over the two-time defending ACC champion Blue Devils. The victory snapped the Tar Heels' seven-game losing streak to Duke, which dated back to 1983.

"It's wonderful. It seems like it's been forever (since last beating Duke)," said Berkebile, a 5-10 senior from Johnstown, Pa., who was named ACC Player of the Week after averaging 13 kills in four matches. "We've always come close, but we always seemed to come up short."

difference between Tuesday's win and the previous seven losses to UNC's dastardly rivals from Durham, Berkebile said, "We didn't have as many unforced errors. Instead of beating ourselves, we forced them to beat us and they couldn't."

After splitting the first two games, North Carolina got some timely play from senior Dawn Wood to win the pivotal third. With the score tied at 10, the Tar Heels reeled off five straight points to grab a 2-1 lead in games. The key play came at 13-10 when Wood stuffed Kerstin Karlsson's spike attempt right back through the middle of a startled Duke defense.

In the fourth and final frame. UNC transformed a 3-3 tie into a 14-7 advantage on the strength of some inspired play by Ann Schildmeyer. She was all over the floor diving, leaping, skidding for any loose ball within reach and some that seemed unreachable.

When Wells, who finished with a team-high 19 kills, spiked a shot off Susan Wilson's face, the win belonged to the Tar Heels and a very large monkey was off third-year coach Peggy Bradley-Doppes' back.

"According to the outside public, we were the underdogs," said Bradley-Doppes, who finally got her first win against Duke as a coach. "We're playing a lot of young players and they're starting to jell as a unit. I think (Duke) was surprised to see us playing this well, this soon."

UNC is now 8-3 overall, 1-0 in the conference. Duke dropped to 4-2 and 0-1 with the loss.


North Carolina's next tests will be stiff ones. Volleyball powerhouses Penn State and Colorado St. visit Chapel Hill Sep. 25 and 26 for a pair of battles that Bradley-Doppes said her team "will use to see where we stack up against the very best."

UNC Athlete of the Week

The UNC Athlete of the Week award this week goes to field hockey hotshot Julie Blaisse (pronounced BLAHS, as in "I give my defensive opponents the blahs"). This freshman import from The Netherlands was a key figure in the UNC field hockey team's two wins over the weekend, scoring three goals as North Carolina beat No. 6 Iowa 4-1 Friday and Old Dominion, last year's national runnerup, 3-1 on Sunday.

Blaisse scored two goals in Sun-

day's game and one Friday. She leads the second-ranked team in the nation in scoring with five goals and two assists despite having to adjust to the different style of American field hockey play — Blaisse described the American players as "ruthless." She has not yet described the experience of winning the UNCAOTW award, but we are sure it would be something more complimentary.

Men's Soccer - North Carolina will face third-ranked South Carolina today at Fetzer Field at 4 p.m. The Tar Heels have never been beaten by USC in Chapel Hill, but South Carolina comes into the game as a solid favorite with a 7-1 record. The Gamecocks are led by forward Dan Ratcliffe, who has 17 points on six goals and five assists. USC's goalkeeper Charles Arndt has allowed only seven goals in the Gamecocks' eight matches and has recorded four shutouts.
