

Symphony to perform today

Lynn Glasscock, UNC percussion instructor, will play the marimba as the featured faculty soloist for the Carolina Wind Symphony's third annual Concert on the Green Friday.

The concert, sponsored by the Carolina Union and the music department, will begin at noon on the steps of South Building.

Glasscock, accompanied by the Wind Symphony, will perform "Sonata for Marimba" by Peter

Turner. A standard piece in three movements, the sonata has a fast first movement, a slow second movement and a fast third movement with a small cadenza.

The marimba is not commonly heard as a solo instrument. "Although most people have heard the marimba commercially, it has a sound that you probably wouldn't recognize," said Glasscock. He described the instrument as a member of the xylophone family with resonators under wooden bars which are

struck with yarn mallets. Other music on the program ranges from turn-of-the-century marches to overtures.

"American Colonial," a piece by principal faculty composer Dr. Roger Hannay, is scheduled to be performed. The music Hannay used for the composition was taken from the work of early American composer William Billings.

Since the concert is partly celebration of the University's birthday, a large cake will be served afterwards.

agency imposed June 12, Cachelia said.

"This morning's proclamation will certainly hurt the UDF, but not to such an extent that it will be crippled," he said. "We are certainly considering the possibility now that we are going to be banned."

Murphy Morobe, the front's publicity secretary and one of those in hiding, told The Associated Press: "It's part of the whole strategy to begin to emasculate the organization."

He said the UDF had about 2.5

million members in 850 affiliated civic associations, trade unions, church and student groups. The nation's most prominent anti-apartheid figures are among its supporters.

Since the state of emergency was declared, Cachelia said UDF affiliates have relied almost completely on the national organization for funding of local programs.

The government contends the anti-apartheid coalition is an internal arm of the outlawed African National Congress.
