Symphony to perform today

Lvnn Glassock, UNC percussion instructor, will play the marimba as the featured faculty soloist for the Carolina Wind Symphony's third annual Concert on the Green Friday.

The concert, sponsored by the Carolina Union and the music department, will begin at noon on the steps of South Building.

Glassock, accompanied by the Wind Symphony, will perform "Sonata for Marimba" by Peter

Turner. A standard piece in three movements, the sonata has a fast first movement, a slow second movement and a fast third movement with a small cadenza.

The marimba is not commonly heard as a solo instrument. "Although most people have heard the marimba commercially, it has a sound that you probably wouldn't recognize," said Glassock. He described the instrument as a member of the xylophone family with resourators under wooden bars which are
