

Placement service to hold workshop

squeezing in a couple of extra hours (to lecture)."

Antle said the University would be willing to close the airport if an alternative airport could be built.

"If it weren't for the AHEC program, I think the University would have closed it years ago," he said. "The AHEC program is an important part of the University."

Noise from the airport's planes and its location are two reasons why the town wants the University to close the airport.

Two schools, Estes Hills Elementary and Guy B. Phillips Jr. High, lie no more than 1,000 yards from

the runway. Two other schools, Chapel Hill Senior High and Culbreth Jr. High are in the take-off flight pattern.

To the north of the airport lies a landfill, and to the east and west are residential sections, according to Burke.

In 1981, a plane crashed in the wooded area behind Seawell Elementary School. A group called the Citizens for Airport Planning began petitioning for the airport to close. Julianne Andresen, Chapel Hill Town Council member and a resident of the area for 16 years, helped direct the group.

"When the planes go over, they are very noisy," she said. "They come over very low, and you can have people up there who don't know what they're doing."

Andresen said she realized that the University is trying to cooperate with the residents by cancelling practice landings, for example. But she said there have been accidents at the airport, and although they might have been pilot error, it's no consolation to residents.

To avoid the residential areas surrounding the airport, the landing pattern differs from those at other airports, Burke said. Airplanes

usually enter from the left, but at Horace Williams they enter from the right.

"We're trying to keep air traffic on the north side of the airport to keep from having so much traffic over the city," Burke said. "We're very sensitive to the community and will do anything in our power to appease them."

Horace Williams' future is up in the air. The University will only accept an alternative with AHEC approval, and until then, according to Antle, the airport will continue serving the needs of the University.
