"It's pretty obvious that the only people that benefit from (the parking agreement) are athletes," he said. "The hours coincide with the hours of the training table."

"He tried to leave in his convertible, and while he was backing out into this huge crowd of people, with one foot on the gas and one foot on the clutch, there were glass beer bottles being thrown at him," Bullock said. "If one of those bottles had hit him on the head, you would have had that car out of control in the middle of the crowd."

The policy is due to the number of athletes who eat at the training table, according to Athletic Director John Swofford. "You have 400 athletes who eat in Ehringhaus, and they obviously don't all live there," he said. "It's unreasonable to expect people who live off campus and in other dorms to have parking stickers for Ehringhaus."

Scroggs said there wasn't a problem. "If the parking was being blocked up all day long, then that would be a problem."

Johnson said that complaints had been made through the traffic office, and the residence hall government had considered a petition. "There were complaints last year," Johnson said, "and I have heard by word of mouth that there were problems in years past, but we're up against the athletic department."
