Defense, Bailey keyed UNC victory vs. Cavaliers Saturday

In UNC's game against the Clemson Tigers, the Tar Heels had a bit of a problem with its defense, to the tune of 38 points scored against them. But defense was one of the keys to UNC's win over the Virginia Cavaliers.

Throughout most of the season the Tar Heel defense has been doing a balancing act. One week it's harder to get through, around or over than the Berlin Wall, and the next week a team could drive a truck through it.

In the second quarter of the Virginia game, junior defensive tackle Carlton Bailey sacked Virginia's quarterback, Don Majkowski, twice for crucial losses.

Bailey found holes in the Virginia offense that no one knew were there. One minute Majkowski was back to pass, and the next he was eating grass for lunch.

Junior defensive tackle Reuben Davis was another UNC player who made the plays all afternoon. Whe-

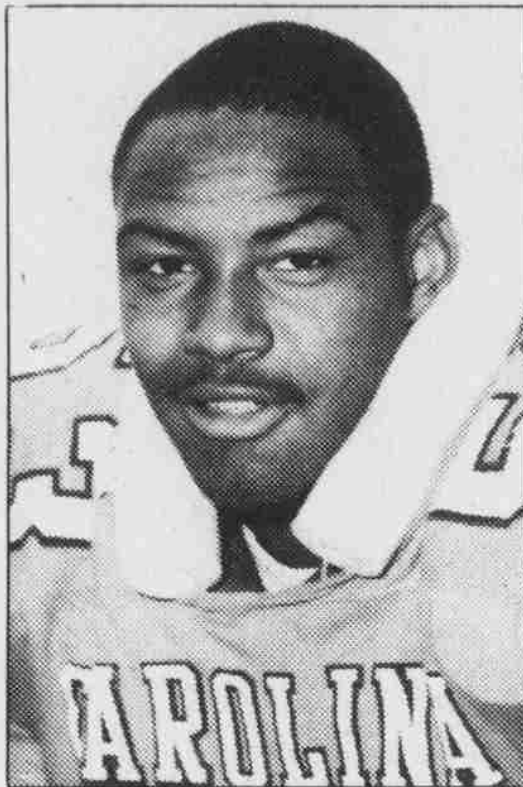
never there was a key defensive play to be made, UNC was there. The defense was armed and ready to attack with the intensity and determination of an animal stalking its prey.

The Tar Heel defense allowed the Cavalier offense to rush the ball 40 times for 48 paltry yards, a total that Derrick Fenner septupled singlehandedly.

The defense played together as a team, in contrast to last week when the Clemson option attack ran UNC ragged.

Saturday's game against the Cavaliers was different, because each player kept up with his assigned man. "We were real aggressive," Bailey said. "We know that we all are a family, and we have to play hard football."

He also commented on the lack of fan support. There were more than 22,000 no-shows for the Virginia game. Bailey said he wished the fickle Tar Heel fans were like the ones at Clemson and LSU, who always backed their teams.



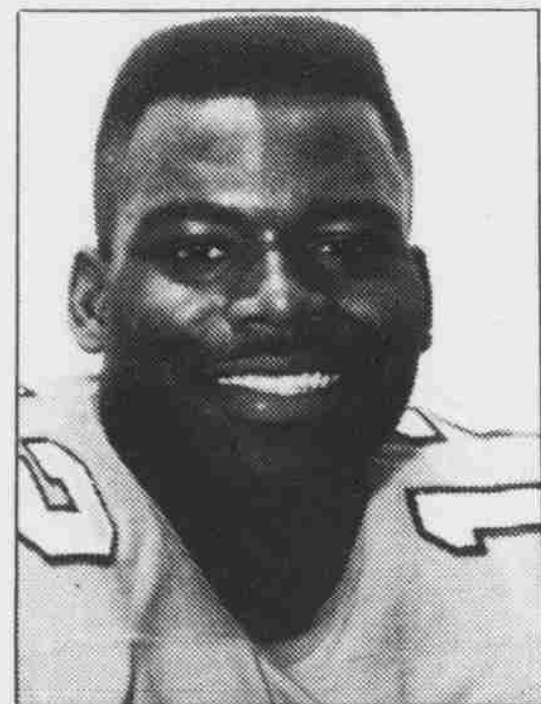

However, the 28,000 who showed up sat in the rainy stands dutifully, and cheered their team to one of the most convincing victories of the year.

UNC Athlete of the Week

There were many clutch performances this weekend in Tar Heel sports — Jim Farmer winning the men's cross country Region III race with his superior finishing kick, April Heinrichs scoring three goals in the first half to spark the women's soccer team to an 8-0 NCAA rout and Carlton Bailey romping through the Virginia backfield.

But there was really no doubt who the Daily Tar Heel Athlete of the Week award should go to this week. Derrick Fenner, who if he was a racehorse would be characterized a good mudder, ran through the Cavaliers like water through a sieve as he pounded for 328 yards in 39 carries. Fenner becomes the first two-time winner of the award this season. He also got it for his 216-yard effort against The Citadel.

Fordham proposes ineligibility for revenue team frosh

The expected has occurred. Tuesday, the chief executives of six large universities submitted to the NCAA a resolution calling for freshman ineligibility in the sports of football and men's basketball.

The proponents of the resolution are UNC Chancellor Christopher Fordham III; Edward Foote II, president of the University of Miami; Kenneth Keller, president of the University of Minnesota; Bruce Poulton, chancellor of N.C. State; the beleaguered John Slaughter, chancellor of the University of Maryland; and Charles Young, chancellor of UCLA.

The proposal asks the NCAA, in its next convention in January, to approve in principle the ineligibility of freshmen for varsity competition in the aforementioned sports. Once the convention does so, the matter would be referred to the Presidents' Commission for the drafting of specific regulations.

"This is an academic matter," Fordham said, "and our students should come first."
