Neither man would speculate on how their vote might affect other board members, but according to a report in the Durham Morning Herald, J. Clint Newton, former chairman of the Board of Trustees, predicted a vote in favor of full divestment - possibly as soon as the board's next meeting in February. "The noose has been tightened," he

was quoted as saying of the 6-5 vote. Farris W. Womack, vicechancellor for business and finance, addressed the trustees during their Dec. 12 meeting. In a telephone interview Tuesday night Womack said he told the board at the meeting that investment in South Africa was not a good risk due to the nation's deteriorating economy.

Conditions in South Africa have made investment there subject to a higher risk — a condition aggravated by sanctions imposed by Congress and the exodus of 81 corporations in the last two to three years, Womack said. "South Africa is a disproportionate risk and should be avoided," he said.

Voting to recommend total divestment on Dec. 12 were William J. Darity, Jenrette, Newton, Porter and Student Body President Bryan

Voting against the measure were Robert C. Eubanks, Maurice J. Koury, Barbara Perry, Earl N. Phillips Jr. and George Ragsdale. Elizabeth S. Dowd abstained. At the October meeting only




