#### hospitals)."

Donelan said hospitals cannot solve the indigent care problem without help from other areas, although they can increase their efficiency.

"What we have is a societal problem being solved on an individual basis," Donelan said.

Indigents often work in jobs that don't provide an employee health insurance plan, Donelan said.

"There are a lot of people like farmers, small businessmen and skilled tradesmen, who basically don't have adequate health insurance," he said.

James Johnson, senior fiscal analyst of the fiscal research division of the N.C. Hospital Association, said indigents need more employee health insurance.

"There is a direct relation between the size of the business and the health care coverage (provided by the business)," he said.

Indigents also tend to be younger and to include a large amount of children, because the elderly are covered by Medicare, a federal health care program for people age 65 and over, Johnson said.

In North Carolina, indigents are usually found in hospitals in the rural areas of the northeastern, southeastern and far western portions of the state, Johnson said.

N.C. hospitals do not deny treatment, but may sometimes transfer an indigent patient to another hospital that is better able to handle the burden if the patient is stable and is facing a long stay, Erwin said.

A bill to increase the number of people eligible for Medicaid, a federal-state program that helps pay for health care for the needy, aged, blind and disabled, has been sent to

said. To be eligible for Medicaid, a family has to be below both the federal and state poverty lines, he said. Because North Carolina has an unusually low poverty line, it is difficult for North Carolinians to receive Medicaid benefits.

"For a family of four in North Carolina to be below the federal poverty line, they would have to make less than \$11,000 (per year). To be below the state poverty line, they would have to make less than \$4,000 (per year)," Erwin said.

The bill under consideration would extend Medicaid to pregnant women below the federal poverty level, increase the amount of eligible blind, elderly and disabled people and would extend coverage to unemployed family men, he said.

"Even at the most, those (Medicaid) expansion options are going to leave a big chunk of people uninsured," said Chris Conover, associate in research for the Center for Health Policy Research and Education.

Some people not protected by Medicaid will be helped by a "safety net" of over 60 local community health centers spread throughout North Carolina, Conover said.

As another attempt at solving the indigent care problem, the N.C. state legislature should encourage small businesses to band together in "multi-employer trusts" to take advantage of lower premiums for health insurance offered to large companies, Conover said.

"It's important to understand the extent to which this problem could be solved by the private sector if they would offer more coverage," he said.


