Doughton said: "Staying in the residence hall is great because it gives the freshmen a feeling of how small the room is and makes them aware of how much stuff they should bring. If they are rooming with someone they do not know at C-TOPS, it gives them a taste of what is to come if they are in the same situation in the fall."

Freshmen also attend several programs to help them adjust to college life, such as "Changes and Choices," "Security Services" and "Student Life — The Real Story."

Many of the programs include skits performed by the orientation commissioners and are followed by discussion in small group sessions. "The skits deal with problems such as how to handle your roommate coming in drunk and roommate incompatibility," Shackelford said. "Later we (the commissioners) discuss the skits with the freshmen as a student and also talk frankly about anything and everything."

C-TOPS also offers an organ-

ized orientation for parents, which includes informational programs covering UNC's Career Planning and Placement Services, campus housing and financial aid.

"The parents' orientation helps parents who are sending their first child to college, lets them know what to expect from UNC and helps them realize what goes on

here," Shackelford said.

Parents attend a program titled "Parenting a College Freshman" presented by the orientation commissioners. The parents' program includes a question-and-answer session with the commissioners and Dr. John E. Reinhold, a clinical social worker from Student Health Service.

"The program for parents gives

them the idea of what their child will go through and of what the parents and the child will go through together," said Shackelford. "If the student says 'I want to change my major,' the parents should respect the child's decision. One of the main messages in the program is for parents to learn to cut the apron strings," she said.

Mrs. Paul Whisnant of Topsail

Beach, the mother of an incoming freshman, said, "(C-TOPS) has been the most helpful thing I have been to." Whisnant said that everyone she had met on campus, including faculty members and the orientation staff, had been friendly and informative.

"That was worth the trip up here," she said.
