

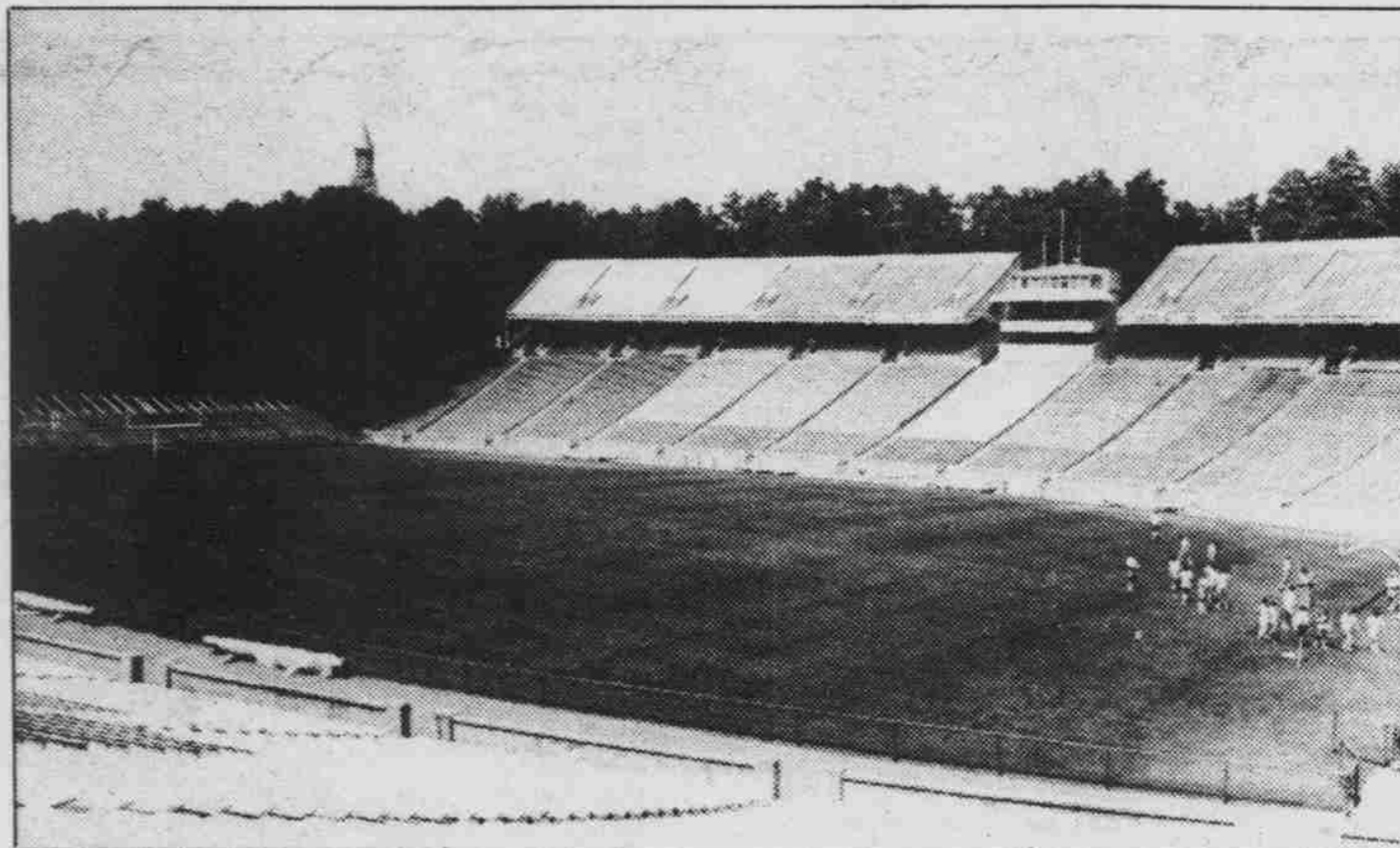
Kenan Stadium

Kenan Stadium, located near the center of campus, is generally referred to as one of the most beautiful football arenas in the country. Inside Sports magazine has rated the stadium as one of the five best places in America to watch a college football game.

Tar Heel football teams have played in Kenan for 59 years. In the first game at Kenan, the Heels

defeated Davidson 27-0 on November 12, 1927.

William Rand Kenan, an 1894 UNC graduate, built the stadium as a memorial to his parents, William R. Kenan and Mary Hargrave Kenan. The complete cost of the stadium and the accompanying fieldhouse was \$303,000. The original seating capacity was 24,000.

The Pit
