

# Filipino chorus to present evening of dance and song

The internationally acclaimed University of the Philippines Concert Chorus will be bringing a taste of the Filipino culture to Chapel Hill Tuesday, Sept. 6, when it presents "An Evening of Philippine Music and Dance" in Memorial Hall.

The chorus, created in 1974, recently won first prize at the 1988 Mainhausen-Zellhausen International Choral Competition in West Germany. This performance will be part of the group's eighth international tour.

Under the leadership of conductor Rey Paguio, the group has performed in stage musicals, on television, at fashion shows and even at protest

rallies. It has represented the Philippines in concert halls all over the world.

The chorus performances are characterized by the members' brightly colored traditional Filipino costumes, which add a cultural flair. The performances are also choreographed, bringing alive the Asian concept of total theater.

Members of the group are students between the ages of 17 and 24 who have undergone music auditions, interviews and a training period of six months before being accepted into full membership with the chorus. Only one-third of the members are music majors.

Conductor Paguio is college secretary of the University of Philippines

College of Music. He is a University of Philippines artist-in-residence and recipient of the 1982 UP professional award as Most Outstanding Music Alumnus of the Year. In addition, he has composed two modern musicals ("Sumpang" and "Ms. Philippines"), and served as choir consultant for choirs nationwide.

Tuesday's concert will include four programs: "Musikang Pinoy," "Inspirasyon," "Variedades" and "Tales of the Manuvu."

The show, sponsored by the Philippine-American Association of North Carolina and the UNC Association of International Students, will begin at 8 p.m. Tickets are \$10 (\$5 for students). For more information, call 933-9239.

important than the other," he said. Students are capable of seeing the University as a whole, Martin said. "But they won't stand by and allow their rights to be trampled on completely," he said.

Other areas of parking improvement to be considered at the Sept.

8 meeting include evening parking, reserved parking at special events for members of the Educational Foundation — or Rams Club — and increased bus service, especially at night, Swecker said.

The committee will not consider at the meeting a suggestion made last

spring to deny permits to faculty and staff members living within a 2-mile radius of the campus, Swecker said. The 2-mile radius rule already applies to students.

The suggestion to extend that rule to faculty and staff was part of a parking policy study done by the Cary engineering firm DeLeuw, Cather & Company.

The committee will also examine how permit revenue is spent and how those expenditures might be changed to finance items more directly related to parking.

Grant's inspirational rock will fill the center at 8 p.m. on October 5. Tickets cost \$16.50 and will go on sale around the world and at the Smith Center box office at 10 a.m. on Sept. 8.

Group rates for Grant are available for groups of 20 or more at \$15.50 each at the Smith Center through mail order (P.O. Box 3000, Chapel Hill, N.C. 27515) with a cashier's check or money order made out to UNCAA. Add \$2 per order for handling.

England's Def Leppard will rock the house at 8 p.m. on Oct. 10. Tickets are \$17.50 and go on sale at 10 a.m. on Sept. 16.

The Plant concert will be Nov. 6, but no ticket information has been released yet.
