

The big news this week is the opening of "Dangerous Liaisons" at the Varsity on Franklin Street. The highly-charged saga of sexual gamesmanship in 18th century France is directed by Stephen Frears ("My Beautiful Laundrette," "Sammy And Rosie Get Laid"), and is based on the celebrated Christopher Hampton play which he adapted from the novel, "Les Liaisons Dangereuses" by Choderlos De Laclos. It stars Glenn Close, John Malkovich and Michelle Pfieffer, and features cinematography by Philippe Rousselot ("Hope And Glory") and costumes from James Acheson ("The Last Emperor").
