Hoops star commits to UNC

From Associated Press reports
OAKTON, Va. — Flint Hill forward George Lynch, heavily recruited by North Carolina and Virginia, said Tuesday that he intends to play for the Tar Heels.
 Lynch, 6-foot-7, averaged 22 points, 11 rebounds and three assists during his one year at the school, about 12 miles south of Washington, D.C.
 Flint Hill coach Stu Vetter said Lynch is one of the best players to come out of the 33-year-old school.
 "We had some outstanding players but George ranks certainly in the top five," said Vetter, who has coached at Flint Hill for 14 years.
 The jerseys of Lynch and teammate Arnon Bain have been retired, Vetter

said. "We've only retired five jerseys in 30 something years. That's a good indication of their abilities. Both came out of here with good grades, and they're going to great universities," he said.
 Bain announced Tuesday that he would attend Villanova.
 Lynch is the second Virginia prep standout to choose North Carolina over Virginia during the current recruiting season. The first was Petersburg High School point guard Kenny Harris.
 The Tar Heels' 1989 recruiting class also includes 7-1 center Matt Westrom of Katy, Tex., and 6-7 swingman Henrik Rodl, a native of West Germany who played for Chapel Hill High School a year ago.

 The National Collegiate Athletic Association began a preliminary inquiry in February after Wade admitted that members of his staff provided transportation for former Terrapins guard Rudy Archer while Archer was a student last fall at Prince George's Community College.
 Wade has denied participating in or authorizing the transportation, a recruiting violation under NCAA rules.
