The North Dakota climate, with snow, drier air and extreme temperatures, took some getting used to, the brothers admit.

Trevor said the bitterly cold winters are "no big deal" because "when the cold comes around, we're inside most of the time."

"It's hard for us to explain to people back home what 40 below feels like," Kaleo added.

SANTA MONICA, Calif. - The son of the late singer Bobby Darin is suing McDonald's Corp. for more than \$10 million, alleging the restaurant chain copied his father's singing style

The suit, filed last week in Los Angeles County Superior Court here, alleges that the television ads infringe on rights to Darin's 1959 hit version of

The commercials feature a tuxedoed man with a smiling quarter-moon head, seated at a piano and belting out the hamburger jingle.

and gestures resemble those of Darin, who died in 1973 at age 37 of heart problems. The suit was filed on behalf of Dodd Darin - the singer's son and only heir - and the Bobby Darin Testamentary Trust.

Darin's upbeat version of "Mack the Knife," a song from the 1928 German musical "The Threepenny Opera," sold 2 million copies and won Darin two 1960 Grammy awards.

The suit seeks an injunction halting the McDonald's commercials, \$100,000 in general damages and \$10 million in punitive damages. Also

There was no immediate comment from the agency or McDonald's Corp. in Oak Brook, Ill. Calls to both were not answered during the weekend and there was no response to a message left on an answering machine at McDonald's.

In a similar case, a federal appeals court ruled that singer Bette Midler had the right to sue the Ford Motor Co. over its alleged use of "sound-alike" ad campaign of one of her recordings. The appeals court reinstated the suit, which a lower court had thrown out. The suit has yet to come to trial.
