We rake 'em, they buy 'em

MIAMI — Florists, nurseries and even supermarkets in South Florida are selling the same leaves that folks up North are raking up and trying to get rid of.

"It brings back that Northern atmosphere," said Pam Halliday, a manager at Frank's Nursery in Tamarac, where a bag of six to eight leaves costs \$3.99 to \$4.99.

"People come in bunches to buy them. We're sold out."

"When I was a kid I used to hate them because I had to rake them all the time," said Ohio native John Tsugranes, whose two Palm Beach County floral shops sell bags of leaves ranging in price from \$1 to \$12. "But after 18 years here without fall, I sort of miss them."

Most of the leaves are brought in from the Carolinas. Florists, who douse them with preservatives to maintain their color, say oak and maple leaves are best.
