 Jones said a 1979 petition that had signatures of people in favor of the district was not representative of the neighborhood because a large majority of the people who had signed the petition had either moved or changed their minds.
 Several people questioned the reasons for including the UNC power plant in the proposed district.
 Originally, the Historic District Commission recommended exclusion

of the power plant, but it reversed the decision on this motion during a Nov. 9 meeting.

Council member David Godschalk said, "I find it frankly incredible that the power plant is included because of a laundry which is abandoned."

The commission said the laundry had architectural properties worthy of preservation.

Gene Swecker, associate vice-chancellor of facilities management, business and finance, said inclusion of the power plant was not necessary.

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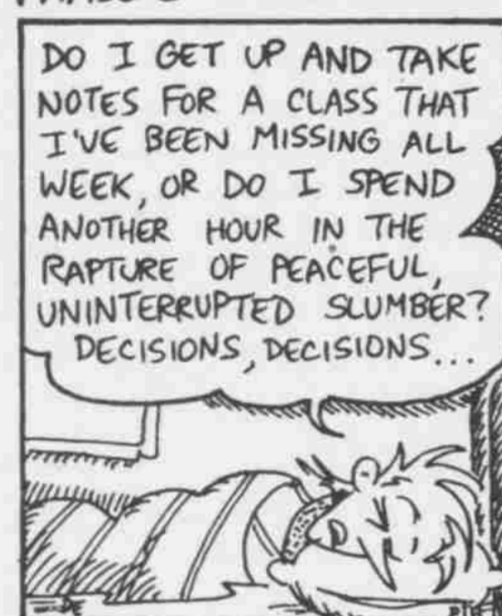

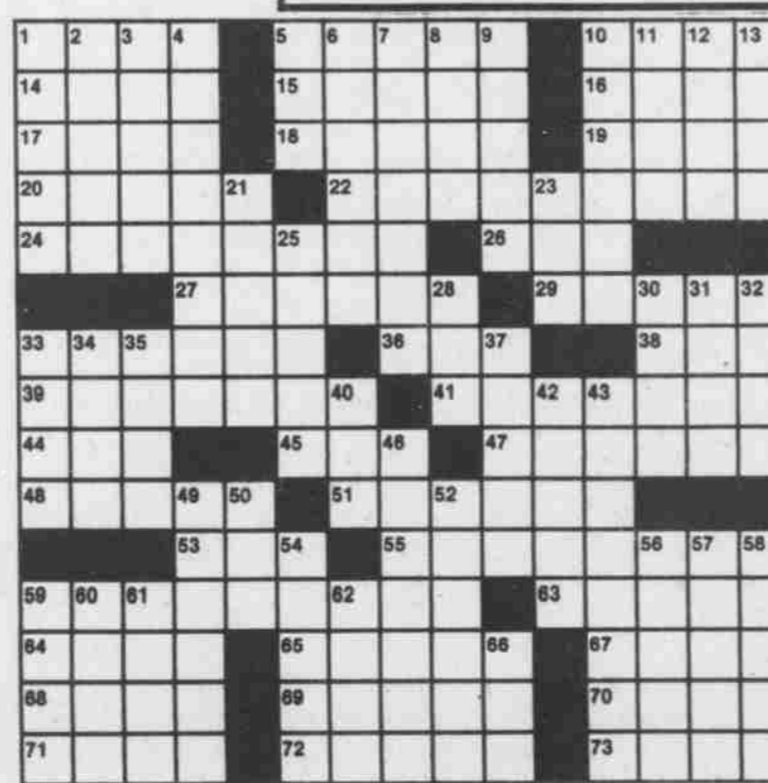
