Sahn," Alden said. "That four is a very solid group (but) the fifth runner is crucial. That fifth runner right now could be any number of people."

The number five runner is needed to replace last season's top performer, Chrissa Nicholas. Most likely, Mel Benner or Judith McCullough, the Georgia state champ last year as a senior in high school, will fill the role.

Boulter and Peterson both ran well last season as the number two and three runners, respectively, and are expected to lead this year's squad. Boulter finished 12th overall in the conference last season, while Peterson came in 33rd.

Peterson, last season's ACC champ in the 10,000 meters, is optimistic about the team's chances this year.

"The team looks pretty good," she said. "We have quite a few seniors coming back and we should be an experienced team."

Both the men's and women's squad hope to be in the hunt for the ACC title this year.

"I certainly think that our teams are going to be in the hunt," Alden said.

"At least in the top half (of the conference). I think we're a much better team overall that we were last year. We've got a lot of depth, and our front runners have matured significantly. They ran very well last spring and I hope that bodes well for the fall."
