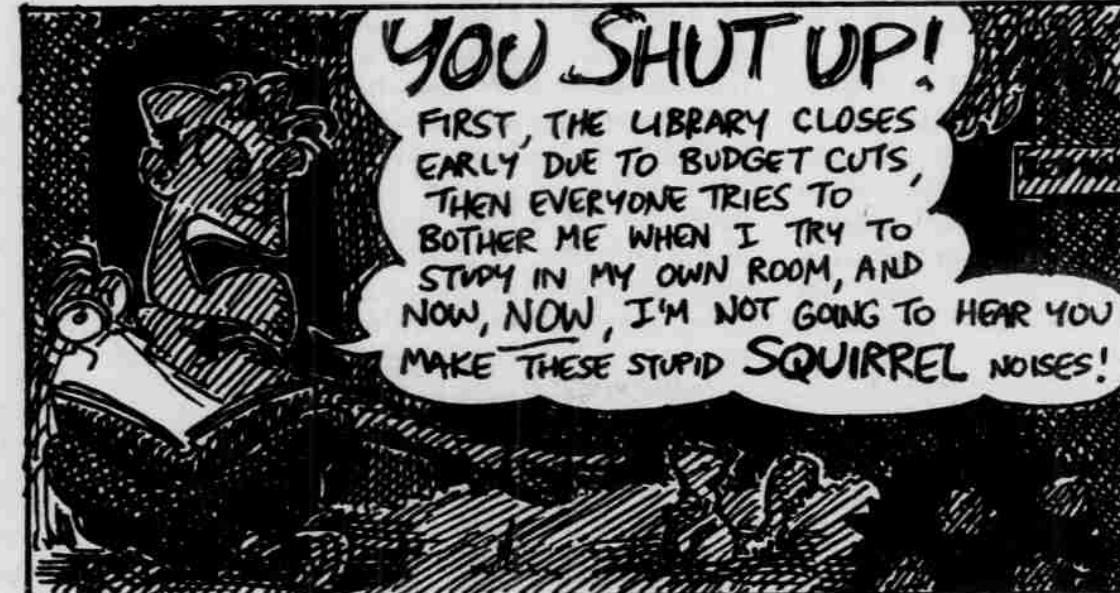

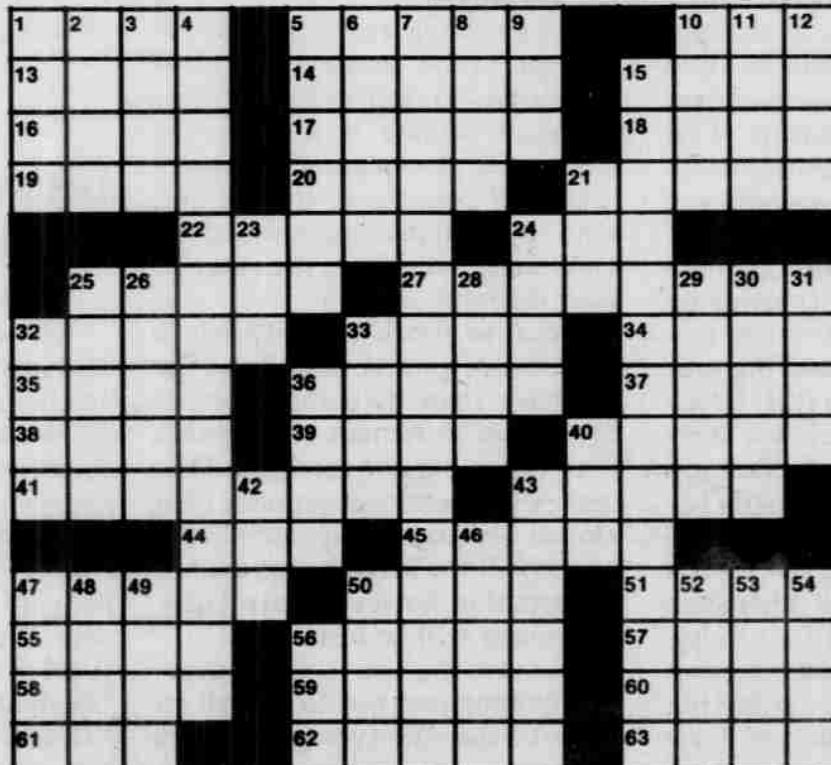

problem. "The system is failing because they try to treat the symptoms and not cure the disease," he said. Frederic Schroeder, dean of student affairs, said hate crimes occurred because people sat back and allowed them to happen. Hildebolt and Kleinschmidt urged students to begin eradicating hate crimes instead of waiting for administrators to draft policies against hate crimes. Speakers said they were frustrated with the way the University handled recent incidents and its policies about discrimination. Baker said the University's race relations policies were vague and unhelpful to victims. "They tie the victims up in red tape." Malini Moorthy, SARR co-chairwoman, presented a petition requesting

"At white fraternity parties, you have people getting stabbed, tear gas being thrown and beer bottles dropped on people's heads," he said.
