New York, Sept. 16.—With Steel Western Union and a half dozen railroads making new high records on the stock market today it was no surprise to find that the actual loans at the close of business Friday night had increased \$4,244,000. I was surprised, however, that the surplus showed an increase of \$19,146,890 and the deposits \$10,175,000. These latter figures are accounted for by the great old importations. The average statement showed an increase of \$3,852,980 in surplus, a decrease of \$587,000 in loans and an increase in net demand deposits of \$1,398,000.

Steele had two distinct movements into new high territory. The first was almost immediately after the opening and carried the stock to 107.14 at nearly the same time Western Union established its new high price by crossing 101. The fact that these two standard securities were selling at the highest prices they had ever touched and that even these prices did not discount their marvelous earnings, caused considerable excitement in the street.
