A CAMPAIGN OF HUMBUG

(New York Times.) "No sooner was the nomination assured than the robes and ermine of the Judge fell from the candidate as if by magic, and there appeared in their place the motley wear of the ordinary office seeker." Mr. Richard Olney describes exactly the Republican campaign. It has no other motive, purpose, policy, than to get into power again, get the offices again. Amid a continual evocation of ghost issues, that is the one Republican issue. Long before the robes and ermine were doffed by the candidate so edifying coy and reluctant, the Republican old stagers had rehearsed the comedy. They hated and hate Mr. Roosevelt. His nomination would have meant something. The Hon. Frank H. Hitchcock, cleverest of political scoundrels, spied out the land. He confabulated with the politicians. He picked up Hughes delegates always without the connivance of the cloistered candidate whom the Republican sages had fixed on, not because they had any love for him, but because he had been secluded from political controversy for six years, had no known opinions on the questions of the day, was colorless, "safe."

Even the eleventh-hour issue, the Adamson eight-hour law, is humbug. The majority of the House Republicans who dared to vote on it voted for it, and, as Mr. Olney points out, a single filibustering Republican Senator could have blocked its passage. And Mr. Hughes is trying to make an issue of it, having taken good pains not to protest against it when it was before Congress. "A pettier and more ignoble game of politics was never conceived," is Mr. Olney's estimation. A suitable addendum to a canvass of humbug and nothing but humbug.
