"DUTCH" LEONARD'S THREE AMBITIONS.

The Remarkable Achievements of a Twenty-Four-Year-Old Star.

From the World's Series Issue of the Baseball Magazine. No other pitcher in the game is more absolutely unhittable than "Dutch" Leonard, of the Red Sox, when he is feeling right. He may not be the most dependable, but he is certainly the most brilliant performer of the renowned Red Sox pitching staff. On the twenty-ninth of August Leonard was batted out of the box by the St. Louis Browns. On the thirtieth he shut them out without a hit. The player often forgets the vicissitudes of today in the expected triumphs of tomorrow, but if there is a swifter, more decisive transition from failure to success than to be driven from the box one day and to pitch a no-hit game the next, we have never heard of it.

When "Dutch" Leonard entered the major leagues he had three ambitions. It is true he scarcely hoped to realize

them, but he believed in aiming high. The greatest pitcher in the world might be proud to claim any one of the trophies which Leonard set himself to attain. Now at the age of twenty-four, he has gained them all. His three ambitions are realized, and what he will set himself to win henceforth, we can't even guess.

What were these three ambitions? First, to win a world's series game. Last fall Grover Alexander entered the series as the greatest pitcher of the year. He humbled the Red Sox in their first encounter. He met them again in the third game, a contest whose importance it would be hard to overestimate. And Leonard had his wish. He won a world's series game, not a fluky contest, but against the master pitcher of the year and by as brilliant a piece of twirling skill as has ever been witnessed. Three hits the Phillies scored, one of them should have been classed as an error by Speaker, and uncertain support marred the first three innings, but as Leonard fairly gripped the game, the Phillies never had a chance. The last eighteen men retired in order without the semblance of a hit, and finally the mighty Alexander bowed quite as much to superior pitching as to superior offensive attack and yielded the palm of victory to his invincible opponent. Leonard had his wish, a world's series victory, by as masterly a performance as the game has seen.

Another of Leonard's three secret ambitions was to prove the most effective pitcher of a season. And he did. Incidentally, though, he established a record which should stand for years and may never be beaten. In 1914 he allowed but 25 earned runs in 35 pitched games. Some of these games, of course, were not for a full nine innings, but his grand average for the season was 1.01 earned runs

AUSTRIAN CYCLISTS COMPRISE COAST GUARD

Vienna, Oct. 6.—The "Austro-Hungarian Cyclist Naval Battalion" forms part of the Austro-Hungarian army, naval seagoing and is being used in the defence of the Adriatic Coast. The sailor cyclists are able to cover quickly wide stretches of the coast, the defence of which is entrusted to the navy, to beat off raids, attempted landings or aerial attacks.

Tokio, Oct. 6.—The fact that a loan to Russia of 70,000,000 yen (about \$35,000,000) was twice over subscribed by the public has attracted considerable attention in Japan and is regarded by the press as indicating faith in the victory of the Entente Allies and faith in the power of the rehabilitation of Russia. The loan was at 6 per cent, and consisted of Russian treasury bonds. It is likely that additional loans of a similar nature will be made subsequently as Russia desires to raise a total of 250,000,000 yen in Japan (about \$125,000,000). It is understood that the loan will be utilized in the payment of munitions of war purchased in Japan by Russia.



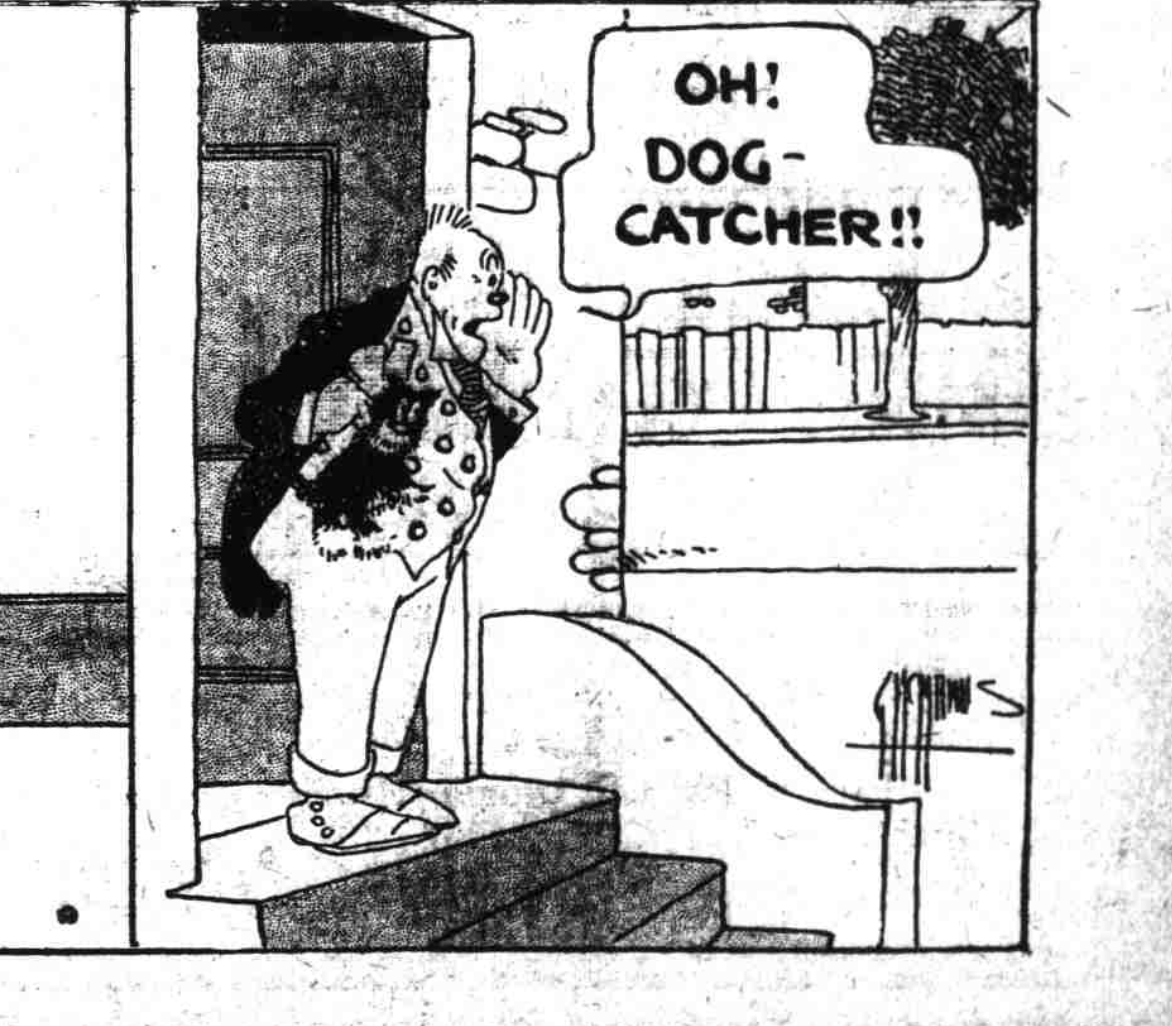
