New York, Nov. 20.—There was an extremely active and exciting opening in the cotton market today, with first prices at an advance of 20 to 39 points on active months and 9 points on October. All positions made new high records, January selling up to 20.94, and May to 20.32, or about 38 to 44 points net higher. There was heavy realizing at this level and price fluctuations were more or less irregular.
