Delany, chairman of the Record Committee, of the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States, has made public his report on the applications for records made by athletes on track and field and in the water, which will be submitted at the annual convention of the A. A. U. in New York City. Six world and three American records were broken on track and field and six world marks were equalled. Five world and twelve American records were swamped and twelve American swimming records established by women. James E. (Ted) Meredith and Robert Simpson ask to be credited with four world's records. The Penn River seeks recognition for making a new world's mark for the quarter and half mile. Simpson asks that his name be inscribed on the honor roll for shattering the world mark for the 120 yard and 220 yards low hurdles.
