degree, but among the negro population it is a vice carried to extreme. Fetischeiros each have followings, some of them of thousands. They organize societies and hold dances which degenerate into orgies of the lowest description. They prey on the superstitions of their victims and often become rich by their extortions.

Clairvoyants, fortune tellers, carto-l mantes, fakirs and others claiming mysterious powers ply their trades openly. Societies of mystic, crystal ball gazers, and "cults" of considerable respectibility flourish by appeal to superstition. Police and newspaper campaigns have done much to rid the larger cities of these mystery workers but the superstition which makes their business possible and profitable remains. The fetischeiro is the "padre's" rival.
