SHOULD UTILIZE WILMINGTON.

Wilmington is a port that the government can obtain big benefits from by utilizing in the present war and in taking advantage of its strategic position for use after the war, when a big navy must undoubtedly be maintained and when a helping hand will have to be given in the building-up of a large merchant marine. Both of these are important and the government, naturally, in justice to all the people, who are the government, wants to get the best results at the smallest expenditure of money. Wilmington offers excellent chance for obtainment of the best results, and it is well for the business interests of Wilmington to call attention to these things. This they are now doing and there should be no let-up. Wilmington has a big natural advantage by being a port. This should be developed.
