Food Administrator J. G. McCormick desires to announce that signers of food pledge cards may return them to him, or to the Special Aid, or the church, or to Raleigh.

Mr. McCormick is in receipt of a letter from the United States Food Administration which expresses gratification at the fine showing made throughout the country.

"Washington, D. C., Nov. 9, 1917. "Dear Sir:

"Since our country entered the war, repeated appeals, financial and otherwise, have been made to the people of the United States, each time with an increasingly generous response.

"It must be pleasing to you as it is gratifying to us, to realize that as a result of your efforts and those of your associates ten million homes have already been pledged to the vital cause of Food Conservation.

"Please, in writing your letter, whether it be brief or full, address Mr. F. C. Walcott, care of the United States Food Administration.

"With thanks, we beg to remain, Yours sincerely, "H. J. HILL, "National Campaign Director, "O. B. TOWNS, "Director Eastern Division."

A PROCLAMATION TO AMERICAN ALBANIANS

Paris, Nov. 13.—Ismail Bey, former president of the Provisional Government of Albania, has issued a proclamation to the Albanian National party, recently formed in America.

"The ardor of my own patriotism," the proclamation says, "is in no need of a stimulant. Nevertheless, the faith reposed in me by the Albanian National party in America is gratifying."

After calling on Albanians in America to unite, the proclamation concludes: "Thus may we, at the termination of the great world war, place before the Supreme Council of the Powers unanswerable arguments in support of our rights.

More Troops Transferred. Camp Dix, Wrightstown, N. J., Nov. 12.—Another contingent of 1,100 men from the 311th and 312th infantry regiments have left Camp Dix for Atlanta, where they will become part of the national army division in training there.

LUXBURG TO SAIL FOR AMSTERDAM

Expelled German Minister to Leave Buenos Aires on Dutch Ship

Buenos Aires, Argentina, Nov. 13.—The Argentine government has sent a torpedo boat destroyer to the Island of Martin Garcia to bring to this port Count von Luxburg, the expelled German minister to Argentina, so that he may embark on a Dutch steamship for Amsterdam.

Count Carl von Luxburg, after being handed his passports, was taken to the Martin Garcia detention camp on October 12.

Uruguay Prevents Landing. Montevideo, Uruguay, Nov. 13.—The Dutch steamship on which Count von Luxburg, the former German minister to Argentina, has engaged passage back to Europe, was stopped on her voyage between Rio Janeiro and Montevideo by a British warship.

The Uruguayan government has forbidden the passengers on the Dutch vessel to disembark at Montevideo. Among those on board are the Cuban minister to Argentina and the Cuban minister to Uruguay.

CONSOLIDATION OF NATIONAL GUARD

Washington, Nov. 13.—Detailed descriptions of the organization of 26th, 28th, 30th, 36th and 37th National Guard divisions showing just what consolidations of old national guard had been effected to make up the new European standard regiments and divisions were published today by the War Department.

Where the regular enlisted strength of two consolidated guard regiments is not sufficient to bring the new regiment up to its full quota of 3,600 men, surplus men from other organizations or men from the national army camps from the same State have been used to fill up the gaps.

Davies Warfield, president of the Continental Trust Company, of Baltimore, in an address before today's session of the sixth annual convention of the Investment Bankers' Association of America.
