## MRS. DE SAULES ON TRIAL MONDAY

Chilean Heiress Begins Fight For Her Life and Her Boy.

Minelo, N. Y., Nov. 17.—Fighting for her life and for what is even dearer—her boy—Mrs. Blanca Errazuriz De Saules, Chilean heiress, goes on trial here Monday on a charge of murdering her husband, John Longer De Saules, club man, politician and former Yale football star.

"Mother love" is her defense, she will plead that overwhelming affection for the child—five year old Jack—drove her to shoot the man who refused to relinquish the boy.

Mrs. De Saules, once known as the most beautiful woman in South America, is backed by the millions of her estates in Chile. Members of the Errazuriz family have voyaged here to help her fight. This family has given one president to the republic and is one of the most influential in Latin America.

Henry A. Uterhart, defense lawyer, secured an acquittal for Mrs. Carmine, charged with murder, after two sensational trials. District Attorney Chas. R. Weeks, will prosecute.

Weight is also arrayed on the De Saules side. The De Saules family has long been socially prominent in New York.

It has been reported the defense will attempt to show that De Saules was well known in the gay life of New York, and that his wife wanted to get the boy away from him lest the youngster see too much of such surroundings.

The international romance which attended the marriage of De Saules and the South American heiress may also be bared in court. His trial runs through many European capitals. After their marriage, the brilliant young couple traveled extensively.

The De Saules were separated some time before the shooting occurred in the man's country home here—the Box, by court decree the boy was to have spent half the time with each. Mrs. De Saules went to the Box the night of August 3 and demanded her child. When her husband refused and turned his back she shot him.

Little Jack will not be in court. If the mother is acquitted, she will take him and return to her home in Chile.

## LABOR STARTS LOT OF POLITICS

Socialists Profess Joy Over Letting Down of Non-Partisan Boss.

Buffalo, N. Y., Nov. 17.—The American Federation of Labor's new political pot which it got by voting for it today, has already begun to seethe and bubble tonight.

Socialist delegates were in high glee over the official letting down of the non-partisan bars they never have been able to hurdle. They claimed that through the influence they hope to swing in local and national organized labor bodies under the new regime, socialist strength will be doubled throughout the nation within a year.

Friends of the so-called Gompers-Wilson coalition hooted the Socialists' claims and declared that so long as the amicable understanding exists between the present administration at Washington and President Gompers, Democratic control of Congress and Democratic political ascendancy is assured.

President Gompers himself declined to see any great political significance in changing the date of the annual convention from post-election days in November to pre-election days in June.

"There always has been political discussion in the ranks of the convention," said Mr. Gompers, "but heretofore it has all been non-partisan discussion."

There were those who saw evolving from Federation of Labor politics a national labor party such as there is in England, with individual labor representation in State and National Legislative bodies.

The apostles of the creed, who are principally Socialists, foresaw a coalition on a "government ownership" platform of the Socialists, the radical laborites and the middle and north-west farmers.

President Andrew J. Furuseth, of the International Seaman's Union, discussed the political date change. He had earlier in the day declared that the labor of the world ought to let war and peace talk alone, "hoe its own row," and refuse to hate.

## GREAT VIGILANCE BY BORDER PATROLS

El Paso, Texas, Nov. 17.—American border patrols were exercising great vigilance tonight in view of a threat accredited to Francisco Villa, that his forces would raid an American border ranch or town unless the United States lifts the customs embargo against Ojinaga.

The port remained closed tonight and the customs office here was in receipt of orders from Washington that no port held by Villistas would be opened.

Juarez had quieted tonight from the wild excitement which attended the sighting of a supposed bandit advance guard near the city today which the civilian populace believed presaged an attack on the city. Many civilians crossed the river and took refuge here.

Whether Juarez or Chihuahua City would be the next objective of the bandit forces was uncertain. Villa, at the head of the main body of troops was last reported at La Maria Pass but whether he was proceeding to attack Chihuahua City or Juarez was not made clear.

## NO INFORMATION ON NAVAL FIGHT

London, Nov. 17.—The British Admiralty was silent tonight on further details of an engagement between light British naval forces and similar units of the German fleet.

The brief mention was made officially early today that the two groups had met, that the British had engaged the enemy, forced the German's retirement, and were "engaged in chasing them." The engagement occurred in "Heligoland bight."

## A FRESH MONEY CHANNEL IS DUG

**ECUADOR PULLS II OFF REVOLUTION**  
Rebels Are Reported to be Looting and Destroying Towns.

Buenos Aires, Nov. 17.—A serious revolution, with rebels looting and badly damaging towns is under way in Ecuador according to fragmentary advices reaching here today.  
The inhabitants of Quito, capital of the nation, are said to be supporting the rebel faction, which has destroyed parts of railways.  
Railroad traffic has been completely stopped by the revolution.  
No details were available as to the extent of the revolution, presumably owing to the censorship of the Ecuadorian authorities.
