PLEASURE BOATS MUST PAY TAXES

Another Source of Revenue For War Becomes Operative on Today.

The war revenue act provides that on and after October 4, 1917, and thereafter on July first of each year, and also at the time of the purchase of a new boat by a user, if on any other date than July 1, there shall be paid on the use of yachts, pleasure boats, power boats, and sailing boats of over five net tons, and motor boats with fixed engines, and not used for or not built according to plans approved by the Navy Department, an excise tax to be laid on each boat or yacht at rates as follows:

Yachts, pleasure boats, power boats, motor boats with fixed engines, and sailing boats of, or over five net tons, length not over 50 feet, 50 cents for each foot; length over 50 feet and not length over 100 feet, \$2.00 for each foot; motor boats of not over five net tons with fixed engines, \$5.00. In determining lengths, measurements over all will govern.

PRO-GERMANS TO LOSE THEIR JOBS

German Sympathizers Must Get Out of All Government Positions

(By George Manning). Washington, D. C., Nov. 23. All government employees entertaining pro-German sympathies and anti-war sentiment are to be dismissed from the service as the next step to follow the ousting of all Germans from the District of Columbia.

This plan is also to be put into effect in other cities where the government has any considerable number of employees.

As another step towards putting the "America for the Americans" policy into effect the Department of Justice has asked the mayors of large cities to what extent their police departments can be utilized in registering alien enemies.
