FATAL COLLISION.

Three Persons.

Barnwell, S. C., Feb. 12.-One woman and two men were killed and another woman was seriously injured here Sunday afternoon about 6 o'clock when an automobile in which they were riding dashed head-on into a westbound freight engine at the Atlantic Coast Line depot, where the railroad intresects the public road leading from Barnwell to Allendale. The dead are: Miss Ready, Fred Lee, white, and a negro named Johnson; injured is Miss Moody. All of the occupants of the car were from Kline and were on their way home when the accident occurred.

The driver's view of the oncoming locomotive was obscured by a string of freight cars on the north side of the main line, and apparently with no thought of danger he approached the crossing at a rapid rate, according to the testimony of eye witnesses. So terrific was the impact that the automobile was totally demolished and the cowcatcher of the engine was badly damaged.

The heads of both men were horribly crushed and their bodies broken, their death being instantaneous. Miss Ready lived for a short time dying in the waiting room in the depot a few minutes after physicians reached the scene.
