SPANISH CABINET DISCUSSES SINKINGS

Madrid, Tuesday, Feb. 12.-The Italian ambassador to Spain called upon the Marquis de Albucemas, the Spanish Premier, late yesterday and gave him all available information which had been collected by Italy regarding the torpedoing of the Italian steamship Duca Di Genova. The ambassador requested that he be given whatever details the Spanish authorities have been able to collect and was informed that the investigation by the naval authorities at Valencia had not yet been completed.

The Spanish cabinet met today to consider the sinking of the Duca Di Genova, and of the Spanish steamship Giralda. The case of the Giralda is considered one of the most important matters the cabinet has had to consider since the beginning

A dispatch from Madrid on February 9 said that the Italian steamship, Duce Di Genova, of 7,893 tons, has been torpedoed only a mile off Murviedro beach on the Spanish coast. The Spanish steamship Giralda was sunk on January 28. A protest against the sinking was presented at Berlin by the Spanish government on February 8.
