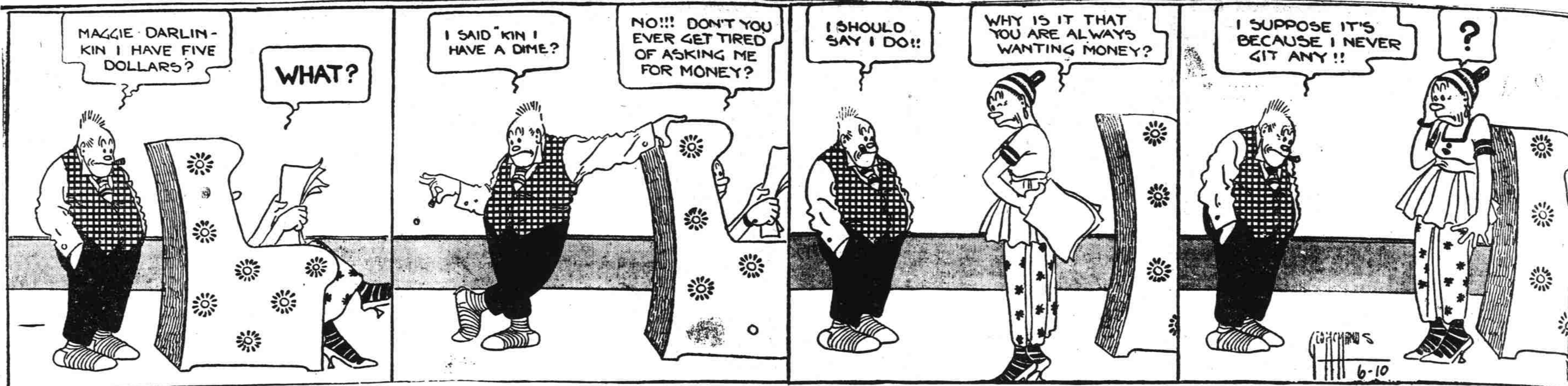

IMPORTANT MEETING ON TOMORROW NIGHT

War Savings Stamp Campaign Workers Are Busy Preparing For the Fray

PLANS ARE OUTLINED

The war savings committee for New Hanover county expects to continue its activity in the work of organized until a full working force has been completed. In order that the public generally may become fully acquainted with the allotments by townships and the districts into which the work is to be divided, a summary is here given by the committee:

North Carolina's allotment, \$48,538,314 New Hanover county's . . . 704,814

Allotments by townships: Cape Fear township . . . \$3,476 Federal Point . . . 14,586 Harnett . . . 69,322 Masonboro . . . 16,874 Wilmington . . . 566,456

The rural part of the county has been divided into four districts by townships. Rural Chairman J. O. Brown will direct the work in the rural sections, assisted by township chairmen, who in turn will have under their vice chairmen. The vice chairmen will direct the work of the community captains and canvassers. The city has been divided into two districts. All of the territory north of Market street is to be known as district No. 1. All of the territory south of Market street is designated as district No. 2. P. H. Mason is to be director-general of district No. 1, and William Struthers, Jr., director-general of district No. 2.

District No. 1 has been divided into three precincts, as follows: All of the territory north of Red Cross street to be known as precinct No. 1; precinct chairman, Rev. J. A. Sullivan. All of the territory bounded by the Cape Fear river, Red Cross street, Eleventh street and Market street, to be known as precinct No. 2; precinct chairman, J. R. Roache.

All of the territory bounded by Market street, Seventh street, Red Cross and Rankin streets and the eastern boundary of the city to be known as precinct No. 3; precinct chairman, C. L. Dickinson.

All of the territory bounded by Market street, Sixth street, Castle street and the river to be known as precinct No. 4; precinct chairman, J. F. Sears.

All of the territory bounded by Castle street, the line of the Tidewater Power company, the southern boundary of the city, and the Cape Fear river to be known as precinct No. 5; precinct chairman, J. H. Custis.

No. 5; precinct chairman, J. H. Custis. All of the territory bounded by Sixth street, Market street, the eastern boundary of the city to the tracks of the Tidewater Power company; thence along the Tidewater Power company's tracks to Castle street; thence on Castle street to Sixth street, to be known as precinct No. 6; precinct chairman, T. R. Ames. The territory in the country townships will be further divided into sections and these sections will be in charge of vice chairmen, who will work under the township chairmen. The communities will be further organized and worked under the direction of community captains.

Every city precinct will be subdivided into four to twelve divisions. These smaller divisions will be in charge of vice chairmen, who will work under the precinct chairmen. In addition a block captain will be appointed for every city block, and the canvassers will work under the block captains.

Prior to the canvass for pledges, which takes place during the week of June 23rd, a complete census of the city is to be made under government direction. The National special aid society have tendered the services of their organization to the war savings committee to take the census. Their block messengers will be inducted into the service of the government for this work Wednesday and the census cards will be carried out during the remainder of the week. Every house in the city will be visited in order that a correct list of citizens may be made and the informant called for on the census cards must be given by the occupants of every house.

The publicity committee for this campaign, composed of Malcolm G. Little and Mrs. George L. Mitchell and Mrs. J. B. Rice, will continue its campaign for advertising space. It is the hope of the committee to have every issue of every paper between now and National War Savings day, June 28, alive with war savings ads. The people must be informed and educated and the publicity committee wishes to see to it that every person is given a full opportunity to become acquainted with the purpose and object of the drive, so that during War Savings Week the people will be ready to sign the pledge cards promptly upon presentation.

An important workers' conference is to be held at the rooms of the chamber of commerce at 8 o'clock, Tuesday night. All workers, including the war savings executive committee and other committees, directors general, chairmen and vice chairmen are expected and urged to be present at this meeting.

PACKAGES MUST BE READY BEFORE COMING SATURDAY. Over 3,000 Red Cross packages are to be made ready by Saturday and the committee in charge of Red Cross work urgently requests every woman in the city to call at committee headquarters in the Murchison building and lend all assistance in the work. Every woman is urged to remember the duty she owes to the men in the service and to respond to this call.
