> (Special to The Dispatch.) New Bern, June 12.-Just how C. C. Cannon, white, and Caesar Nixon, colored, escaped death when an automobile in which they were riding and which crashed into the Norfolk Southern eastbound train at Riverdale Monday afternoon, escaped death is a mystery to those who witnessed the acci-

The men, whose homes are at Havelock, were seen by the engineer when they were some distance from the track but they had ample time to stop and the engineer paid no attention to them. 
