Sloan Says Market Lamba Should Weigh 55 Pounds or More

Efforts are being made to put out a better quality of lambs for the market in Macon county this year. Fred S. Sloan, county agent, is warking with the sheep raisers of the county to get the lambs ready for market 30 days earlier than usual.

This week 60 lambs have been picked out and treated for stomach worms and then placed upon a fresh white clover and lespedeza pasture. A ration of cracked corn, cottonseed meal and ground oats will be fed the lambs this summer Twenty of the lambs thus treat-

of 55 pounds and upwards. Mr. J23-2tc-J30 Sloan says that the lambs treated averaged 48 1-4 pounds.

This is a different method than used before, for it has been a custom to let the lambs run on a mountain range. The men in this project plan to keep a record on the amount of feed and the cost of the grain.
