You can judge the age of fowl by the skin of the feet. Young chickens have tender skin, whereas the feet of older chickens are scaly and the skin is much harder. Also, young chickens have pin feathers, which in the older chickens have turned into long hairs. These are two good tests for buyers.

Before you bake potatoes, let them stand in hot water for fifteen minutes and the baking will take much less time and make the texture of the potato much finer and lighter, in addition to saving fuel—if you are cooking with gas.

To avoid French fried potatoes that are too hard or too limp, soak the potatoes in cold water for a time, put them in hot water for a moment and then dry them on cheesecloth before frying in the usual way.
