Miss Pauline Powers, Miss Amy Harrison and Miss Carolyn Nolen spent Saturday in Asheville shopping.

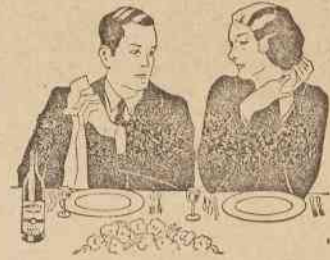
